Option B does not follow this major roadway concept and skips our neighborhoods, separating our kids from the Crossridge area. 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			<p>Thank you for the most recent round of maps that take into consideration some of the community feedback you have received. I am writing in support of High School Option D, which takes into account the concerns of the Pemberton corridor about having our boundaries shifted and our community impacted repeatedly in HCPS redistricting processes. Option D maintains the feeder pattern that HCPS implemented as an important goal during the last redistricting just ten years ago. This feeder pattern brings together both sides of the Pemberton corridor to form one community at Quiocasin Middle School and Freeman High School. I support High School Draft Option D for the following reasons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Option D follows the rules and guidelines for redistricting by using major roads as natural boundaries and supporting community and continuity for students during their K-12 education. For the zoning of the Pemberton corridor, Three Chopt Road forms a clear natural boundary for the Freeman High School zone, which is utilized in this option. -The Option D map helps bring all high schools in Henrico closer to ideal utilization numbers. The utilization of each high school is right at the goal/average in this option and optimally fills the extra space at the brand new Tucker High School. -Option D minimizes the impact on students compared to other options, impacting 784 students, as opposed to 1,092 students impacted by option C, 1,472 by option A, and 2,094 by option B. Every effort should be made to minimize student impacts in this process. -Option D avoids moving an arbitrary group of neighborhoods divided in the middle of a residential area on Pemberton Road, and minimizes repeated impacts on the same families more than once during their K-12 education. As stated by Mr. Cropper, every effort should be made to minimize repeated redistricting impacts on the same communities. -The entirety of the Pemberton corridor is in the Tuckahoe magisterial district. Option D keeps the Pemberton corridor together at Freeman High School, a Tuckahoe district school. This allows community members to have school board representation for our zoned school. -Residents of the Pemberton corridor live less than two miles from both Godwin and Freeman

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			<p>High Schools. Freeman is walkable for our students down Three Chopt or Quioccasin Rd. Moving us to Tucker would create a third feeder pattern, a third high school in ten years for much of the Pemberton corridor, and take us to the third farthest high school from our homes, across a major interstate. This is unreasonable.</p> <p>HCPS created a new feeder pattern for the Pemberton corridor just ten years ago in order to meet the goals of that redistricting process, bringing together the students of the Pemberton corridor to attend Quioccasin MS and Freeman HS. The same communities and families should not be impacted repeatedly. Our neighborhood is west of Gaskins Road, north of Ridgely Parkway, and east of Pump Road. We are approximately a mile from Godwin High School and are currently zoned for Short Pump Elementary, Pocahontas Middle, and Godwin.</p> <p>Regarding high school proposals, I enthusiastically support HS Options C and D. Option D is my preference, as it appears to affect the least number of students and families.</p> <p>Conversely, I strongly oppose HS Options A and B, both of which move our neighborhood from Godwin, which again is a mile away from our home, to Tucker, which is five miles away. As you are aware, there has been a great outcry against the original proposals, and I am very glad to see these new proposals added.</p>

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			<p>Regarding the middle school proposals, every current MS Option - A, B and C - move my family from Pocahontas to Quioccasin. There are no Middle School options that keep our neighborhood at its current school of Pocahontas. It is imperative that new options be added which allow the opportunity for my neighborhood to stay at Pocahontas.</p> <p>In addition, the current MS options fail to meet the standards of the HCPS Policy and Regulations for Redistricting, including:</p> <p>1) Student continuity A stated value of the HCPS Policy and Regulations for Redistricting is that "Provisions should be made to assure the continuity of a child's progress in K12." Under current zoning, a child from my neighborhood would go to Short Pump ES, where 100% of attendees would then move on to Pocahontas, which then feeds 100% of students to Godwin.</p> <p>All of the proposed Middle School options unnecessarily disrupt this normal flow. Under Option C, my child would spend one year at Pocahontas, and then two years at Quioccasin, which would then send 50% of her classmates to two other high schools.</p> <p>Based on statistics provided by the committee, this change is completely unnecessary. Option C would move my neighborhood from Pocahontas, which would fall to 79% utilization. There is no logical reason or observable benefit to making this change.</p> <p>2) Logical Boundaries A stated value of the HCPS Policy and Regulations for Redistricting is that "Major roads and natural boundaries will be used whenever feasible as zone lines." Under the current zoning, the MS boundaries are made using Pump Road, Ridgefield Parkway and Gaskins Road. Since that time, they have built new groups of friends and established strong relationships with the students that follow the Short Pump - Pocahontas - Godwin feeder pattern. We are strongly opposed to any option that impacts these students again in their high school years - this clearly violates one of the critical rules established for the redistricting process, to ensure the continuity of a child's K-12 progress. 2. High School Options A & B and Middle School Options A-D are in direct violation of the HCPS established objective and guideline regarding walking to school - "Efforts will be made to establish walking schools and reasonable walking zones where feasible." <p>Godwin High School is located less than 2 miles away from our community. Routes are available that allow students and their families to easily walk or bike to school without having to traverse any major roadways. Students have biked and walked to Godwin High School safely since the beginning of our community, providing a reduction in motorized traffic and as part of an active and healthy lifestyle. Options A and B eliminate this opportunity for High School students in our community.</p>

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			<p>All proposed Middle School Options eliminate any opportunity for students from the Cross Keys neighborhood to ever walk to Middle School. This is ridiculous given the County has approved and will begin a \$25.24 million improvement project for Three Chopt Road that will include pedestrian improvements along the entirety of the corridor - https://henrico.us/projects/three-chopt-road-improvement/. These improvements will allow students from all neighborhoods west of Gaskins road to or ride their bicycles or walk safely to Pocahontas Middle School for years to come .</p> <p>3. High School Options A & B and Middle School Options A-D are in direct violation of the HCPS guiding principle for using major roads and natural boundaries to define attendance zones.</p> <p>Middle School Options A-D and High School Options A and B violate the Guiding Principle of, "Major roads and natural boundaries will be used when feasible to define attendance zones." Gaskins Road and Ridgefield Parkway fit this guideline perfectly - neighborhoods to the west of Gaskins and north of Ridgefield should remain at Godwin - arbitrarily moving the Cross Keys, Cedar Chase, Dover Hunt neighborhood violates this guideline.</p> <p>4. High School Options A & B introduce unacceptable risks for transportation safety Finally, redistricting the Cross Keys neighborhood to Tucker High introduces a plethora of transportation safety issues for buses and student drivers. Currently, drivers need to navigate only two stop lights and no major intersections to travel from the Cross Keys neighborhood to Godwin High School. To travel to Tucker, student drivers must navigate several major intersections including Gaskins/Three Chopt, Parham/Three Chopt and Parham/I-64 Interchange. This is an unacceptable risk.</p>

In fact, itâ€™s the 3rd smallest in all of Henrico County. At a current enrollment of 284, itâ€™s so small that there are 13 Henrico County elementary schools which are twice the size of Pemberton.</p> <p>Currently, Pemberton feeds 100% into QMS. Pemberton currently splits between two High Schools -- Godwin and Freeman. Of course, it wasnâ€™t always that way. Pemberton used to feed 100% to Godwin, but in the redistricting 10 years ago, Pemberton began to split its feeder pattern between Godwin and Freeman. Youâ€™d think that being such a tiny elementary school, splitting between 2 high schools would be the maximum that school administrators would want to do. By means of comparison, the only two Henrico schools which are smaller than Pemberton each feed 100% to a single High School. The relationships that those children forge in the first 6 years of school are able to be preserved till graduation.</p> <p>However, 3 of the 4 current High School redistricting options are not satisfied with splitting Pemberton between just two high schools. Those options (A, B, and C) take the smallest school in Western Henrico and distribute it to three high schools: Godwin, Tucker and Freeman. Only Option D keeps Pemberton feeding into either Godwin and Freeman -- just 2 High Schools.</p> <p>To put a personal touch on thisâ€¦the 2018-19 Pemberton 5th grade class was just 42 students. By comparison, there are 15 elementary schools which had over 100 students in their 2018-2019 5th grade class. But those unlucky 42 Pemberton 5th graders will be split amongst three high schools. 14 go to Godwin, 14 go to Freeman and 14 go to Tucker. Thank you for listening to our concerns about splitting a residential neighborhood and keeping Oldhouse Run at JDES.</p> <p>I also ant to thank you for the most recent round of maps that take into consideration some of the community feedback you have received. I am writing in support of High School Option D, which takes into account the concerns of the Pemberton corridor about having our boundaries shifted and our community impacted repeatedly in HCPS redistricting processes. Option D maintains the feeder pattern that HCPS implemented as an important goal during the last redistricting just ten years ago. This feeder pattern brings together both sides of the Pemberton corridor to form one community at Quioccasin Middle School and Freeman High School. I support High School Draft Option D for the following reasons:</p> <p>Option D follows the rules and guidelines for redistricting by using major roads as natural boundaries and supporting community and continuity for students during their K-12 education. For the zoning of the Pemberton corridor, Three Chopt Road forms a clear natural boundary for the Freeman High School zone, which is utilized in this option.</p>

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			<p>The Option D map helps bring all high schools in Henrico closer to ideal utilization numbers. The utilization of each high school is right at the goal/average in this option and optimally fills the extra space at the brand new Tucker High School.</p> <p>Option D minimizes the impact on students compared to other options, impacting 784 students, as opposed to 1,092 students impacted by option C, 1,472 by option A, and 2,094 by option B. Every effort should be made to minimize student impacts in this process.</p> <p>Option D avoids moving an arbitrary group of neighborhoods divided in the middle of a residential area on Pemberton Road, and minimizes repeated impacts on the same families more than once during their K-12 education. As stated by Mr. Cropper, every effort should be made to minimize repeated redistricting impacts on the same communities.</p> <p>The entirety of the Pemberton corridor is in the Tuckahoe magisterial district. Option D keeps the Pemberton corridor together at Freeman High School, a Tuckahoe district school. This allows community members to have school board representation for our zoned school.</p> <p>Residents of the Pemberton corridor live less than two miles from both Godwin and Freeman High Schools. Freeman is walkable for our students down Three Chopt or Quioccasin Rd. The primary reason we left NY was because of the quality of the schools in our district. I was so impressed with the success of Nuckols Farm Elementary, Short Pump MS, and Deep Run HS that I opted to move 6+ hours away from the only family we have in the US. I did this believing that my children would have a better education and we, as a family unit, would have a better life in the type of neighborhood I had been longing for. We decided to stretch our budget to buy a house within this specific school district and were happy to have discovered this little community called Fox Hall.</p> <p>Since we moved here, I've realized how much development has happened/is happening in the far west end so in many ways, it was no surprise to me that redistricting has come up. I've talked to my new neighbors and learned that those who have a child in MS and/or HS are very concerned about uprooting their kids (especially at a delicate age) and the inevitable disconnect with younger siblings who have been socializing for years with other families zoned for Short Pump MS or Deep Run HS. There is also an underlying concern that the proposed changes will decrease property values because disjointed districting will negatively effect the sense of neighborhood and child development.</p> <p>Although I may not have lived here long, I can totally relate to the negative effect caused by disjointed school districts on what could be a sense of neighborhood, parent involvement, and healthy child development. I grew up in a house in the suburbs of NYC where the school district line actually went through our property (it actually cut through our kitchen!). As a result, half the kids on one side of our block went to a different school than the other half. For the most part, this microcosm felt seamless for each kid until it was time to go to middle school. Kids in elementary school all played in the street after school and could care less about where they were during the school day. But as each kid graduated up into middle school, we saw less and less of one another. By high school, the older kids were just ghosts. When I was in high school, it required some serious effort to be able to socialize with my classmates across town (often begging my parents for a ride) and as a result, I never felt like I really fit in or connected with my friends and their families like the kids who had all lived near the school.</p> <p>Later in life, I ended up buying a house in a village that is one mile square. Despite its relatively small size, this village too suffered from split school districts. (This is a common issue on Long Island.) A lot like my own experience, my oldest child had many playmates as a toddler but once kindergarten started, our world became more isolated. The elementary school we were zoned for</p>

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			<p>felt like a college "commuter school". There were no more playdates and there was NO sense of community within that school district. Not only did this affect our kids' social experiences, but I also firmly believe it was affecting their development because parental involvement was so dysfunctionally scattered. This is one of the primary reasons why we chose to leave. (We couldn't be happier at Nuckols Farm Elementary, which has so much parental involvement that it's the complete opposite of where we were before.)</p> <p>Suffice to say, my fear is that the proposed redistricting plans may have a serious impact on the sense of community felt around Fox Hall and its neighboring communities. I know this first hand. It's real. If these children have been raised with families going from Nuckols Farm Elementary to Short Pump MS and Deep Run HS, I believe they should stay on that track. Furthermore, my research shows that the entire area that would be south of Patterson Ave and extending east on Patterson Ave. and along N. Parham Rd. south to the river was moved only once starting in the 1990 school and phased in over 2 years from Byrd MS to Tuckahoe MS. This area has been spared from any changes for 30 YEARS. Despite the number of equivalent student populations (and socioeconomic levels in this area) and closer proximity to QMS, none of the map options have suggested moving any of this area back into QMS to alleviate the impending capacity increase for TMS. The current zoning of Quioccasin Middle School is nonsensical - it is hard to imagine how it even came to be. There is no reason for the QMS zone to extend north of Three Chopt Road. The Skipwith Elementary zone is very close to Tuckahoe Middle School and we currently drive past it to get to Quioccasin Middle School, twice as far away. There are other areas north of Three Chopt zones to QMS in a similar boat.</p> <p>Why not just keep the QMS zone south of Three Chopt to feed only to Godwin and Freeman, and have the TMS zone feed only to Freeman and Tucker? The Maybeury area south of Patterson (at least the western part) should feed to QMS, not TMS. That would solve the feeder pattern issue and have TMS split more evenly between Freeman and Tucker. Why is everything south of Patterson feeding to TMS when QMS is clearly closer? That has led to overcrowding at Freeman High School, trying to keep so much of TMS there when half should easily feed to Tucker. Fix the middle school zones first, and the rest will follow. Three Chopt/Gaskins is a clear natural boundary with QMS south of Three Chopt and TMS north (east of Gaskins).</p> <p>Fixing this middle school zoning issue between Quioccasin and Tuckahoe Middle would help the community at Tucker, which currently pulls from too many middle schools. There is no clear continuity. This is unfair to the students of Tucker and it doesn't have to be that way. There seems to be a resistance to moving kids from TMS to QMS (and in turn, moving others from QMS to TMS), but until that happens, you will never fix the zoning for Tucker High School to make students there feel worthy of the same strong continuity enjoyed by those at the other HCPS high schools. Thank you for reading and I hope I have provided valuable feedback. I know this is a very difficult process.</p>

Why do our students not deserve continuity in their education and a "community school concept?"
