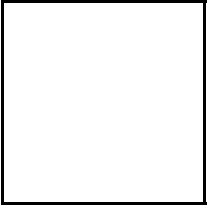

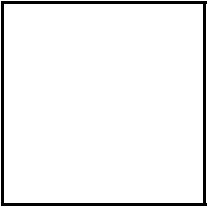

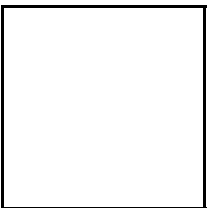

**Subject:** Public Comment on HCPS-FLEMINGAE Redistricting Process

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My name is David Fleming and I would like to thank you for the opportunity to speak to you on Thursday, November 14 during the public comment period of your meeting on the topic of school redistricting.

I was surprised to see what appeared to be a negative reaction, when I stated that volunteer members of the redistricting committee had been vetted and chose by Cropper GIS, not by our elected school board representatives. This was a reaction that seemed to call into question the validity of the statement. Other community members in attendance communicated to me that they had recognized the same reaction.

It was clearly stated by Mr. Cropper of Cropper GIS, at the Godwin information session, that his firm had vetted and selected (from applications) the members who are representing our communities in the redistricting process. This is further confirmed through an article published in Richmond Magazine. I am here attaching a link to the article.

In paragraph 10 of the article, the difference between the process for determining committee members for Richmond versus Henrico County is described. Alone, this should be a red flag for the community.

To quote the article:

"Both local districts have committees that are reviewing proposals. In Richmond, the committee includes School Board members, residents appointed by the board and some school system administrators. In Henrico, Cropper GIS staff selected committee members from submitted applications; School Board members and school staff are not assigned to the committee. Both districts have online feedback forms that are open to anyone."

Our directive from Mr. Cropper at the Godwin event was to communicate concerns based in data, statistics and concerns about the process.

Many members of our community, as you heard on November 14, have serious concerns about the process, the selection process for community member representation being one.

Please reach out to me with questions concerning this email and our community concerns about the process and what many members of the redistricting committee see as a very flawed process for genuinely integrating feedback and recommendations.

I am sure you remember me. I have a concern I want to share with you and perhaps you can let me know how my voice can be heard.

Plans are underway for a new Tucker High School. That is wonderful. I live in the far west end and my son's family, with my two grands, live about two miles from me. They are within a 5 min walk to Godwin High School. Sitting on their back patio we can hear the band practice. The draft plans call for their subdivision to be redistricted to Tucker, which is a 20 min at least DRIVE from their home. How can this possibly be? Isn't proximity a concern? How about the cost of gas to bus children this far from their homes when they could walk? I have no idea how the lines were drawn up and what criteria was used. I know that the neighborhood right beside them (Crown Grand) will still go to Godwin. And it looks like Church Run will also after protests last night at a meeting at Godwin.

My son's neighborhood (Covered Bridge) is a relatively smaller neighborhood so I am afraid their voice is not being heard. My granddaughter will be starting at Godwin next year. If the current plans go through she will have to transfer to Tucker in her Junior year, leaving all her friends behind.

I am at a loss as to who I can talk to about this. Their neighborhood has already been redistricted recently.

### Keep the Pemberton Corridor at Freeman High School!

I respectfully ask that you consider keeping the Pemberton Road corridor at Freeman High School. Just 10 years ago, HCPS redrew and altered school boundaries for the Pemberton Corridor as a way to improve the feeder pattern and bring together the neighborhoods along Pemberton Road.

During the 2010 redistricting, the Pemberton Corridor was dramatically impacted by boundary shifts:

- The neighborhoods of Oldhouse Run, Rockstone, Gates Head, Pemberton West, Candlewood, SpringTree and Quail Run were moved from Godwin High School to Freeman High School.

- The Pinedale Farms neighborhood was moved from Tuckahoe Middle to Byrd Middle (now Quioccasin Middle).

This created a feeder pattern that brought students from both sides of Pemberton Road TOGETHER to attend Quioccasin Middle and Freeman High School. Our current feeder pattern works and has established a strong community along the Pemberton Corridor.

HOWEVER, as Henrico County looks to redraw the 2021 school boundaries there are three options on the table that would move the Pemberton Corridor out of Freeman and into the new Tucker HS zone.

We oppose this move for the following reasons:

1. We just went through this 10 years ago when our school boundaries were last changed.
2. The whole point of moving us last time was to create a feeder pattern that fed the Pemberton Corridor to Freeman HS.
3. Every option currently being considered projects enrollment DECLINE for Freeman HS and INCREASE for Tucker HS. Why move the Pemberton Corridor and disrupt our current feeder pattern? Keep us at Freeman.
4. According to Cropper data, the three options that propose moving the Pemberton Corridor out of Freeman HS also have the HIGHEST option impact statistics for students. Every effort should be made to reduce these impacts. (See Options 3, 5 and 6)
5. Moving us would disrupt the continuity and character of our community and take us to a THIRD high school in just 10 years!
6. Our neighborhood communities are personally invested in Freeman High School; in the athletics, traditions, PTA and overall community of that school.

As the Redistricting Committee continues to adjust attendance boundaries, we urge you to consider these points and respectfully request to **KEEP the Pemberton corridor at Freeman High School!**

Hi

First, thank you for the hard work you are doing not only on redistricting but also managing all that HCPS needs managed.

Second, I think one or both of you know that I am mentoring a committee member who will go unnamed here. I will be forwarding this email to her and I am encouraging her to move this map forward. Also please excuse the typos in the attachment, and note that it is very "pro-Canterbury-Stays-In-Godwin." We (my household) are perfectly fine with moving us to Freeman. My position is that if the number of households that move from one school to another school is higher than necessary, there needs to be a clear benefit. So I tend to start with the smallest number of moves and that allows moves to expand if those expansions then lead to even better outcomes.

Also, in the PDF I mention that the Cox Road --> Deep Run High School commute would be terrible. It is actually not that bad, by using Google Maps and sampling several times over the past few days I have estimated that commute times from Cox Road are about the same to either Tucker or Deep Run, and about 1 minute more commute time to either of those schools as compared to Glen Allen. The area of Springfield Road closest to Broad Street would have a 5-7 minute commute to Tucker, and a 12-15 minute commute to Deep Run.

My counts in the attached spreadsheets are based on data from CropperGIS, same data that was presented during yesterday's map walk. I approximated the counts in Option 3, which aligns with the attached PDF discussion. Matt Cropper would have the census tract level data that would firm up those counts.

Thank you for your interest and let me know if you would like further discussions. I have provided feedback through the online survey as well.

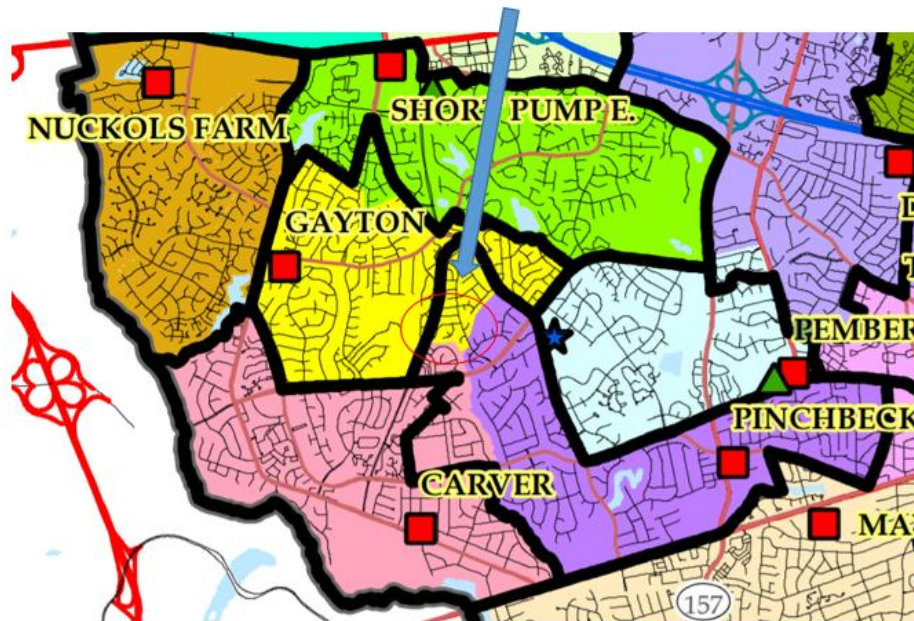

46% Percent of Option A

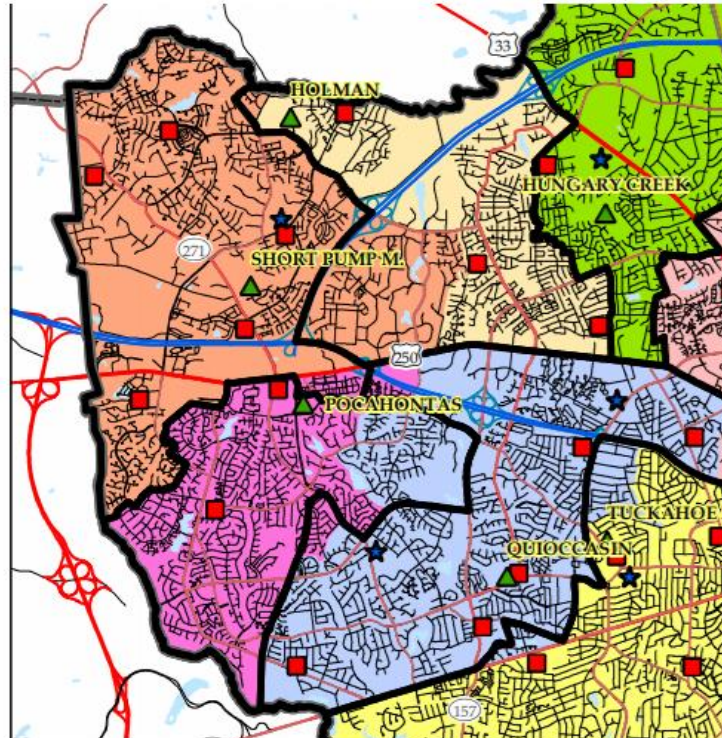
Start with elementary, and Pinchbeck is over-crowded. The solution is Option A. Children who leave Pinchbeck will be close to Carver (but not within walking distance, Lauderdale is not safe for children to cross unless there is a crossing guard for Stewart School(?)). This makes drop off and pick up easier for those households. Option B is a bad option because it pushes a segment of Short Pump to Colonial Trail (the “transients” of a few years ago are once again being pushed around, we should not support that). Note that Option A would over-crowd Gayton Elementary and also push Short Pump once again to 97%. Short Pump people accept crowding to be at SPES. Both Carver and Pinchbeck would have capacity in Option A to take some of Gayton’s students, but the likely problem is that a neighborhood gets split. So understanding which area in Gayton could move either to Carver to modify Option A, or be retained at Pinchbeck and still keep Pinchbeck from being over-crowded, is a place to focus.

Gayton would be at 101%. Retaining one small area at Pinchbeck could resolve that



For Middle School, Option B keeps Foxhall at Short Pump Middle School, and overall results in less middle school crowding everywhere. Option A puts Pocahontas MS at 100% which is not acceptable given that option would also allocate a large area of new development south of Broad and near Nuckols Farm ES to Pocahontas. Option B is the strategic option for Canterbury to stay at Godwin because if Foxhall goes to Pocahontas MS, then Foxhall goes to Godwin; however, if Foxhall stays at SPMS then Foxhall stays at Deep Run HS.

Option 2 keeps Foxhall at Short Pump MS and avoids crowding Pocahontas MS



Moving to the HS, we can see that Godwin's level of crowding is not reduced, but it is also stable and acceptable – lots of people want to go to Godwin. The issue for Canterbury is that moving Foxhall to Godwin push us out. This is a repeat of the 2009-2010 redistricting situation, only this time neither options A or B that will be presented on Wednesday allow Canterbury to stay at Godwin.

Godwin continues at a stable ~95% Enrollment under both options. The corollary is that Canterbury and Kingsley are being pushed out by neighborhoods that want in but are further away

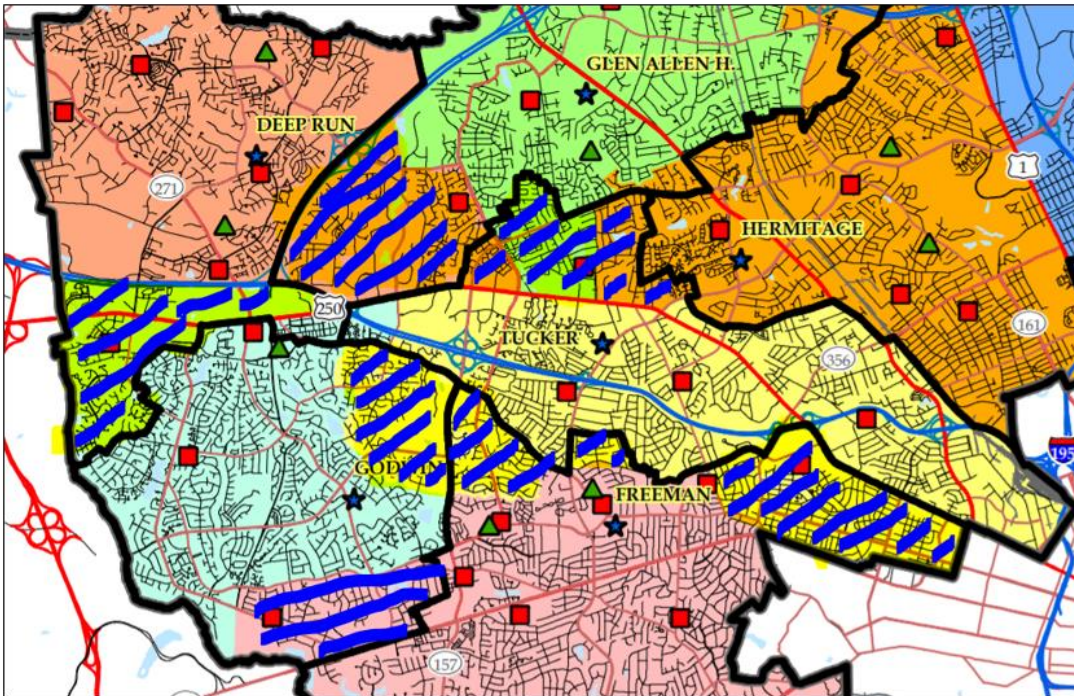

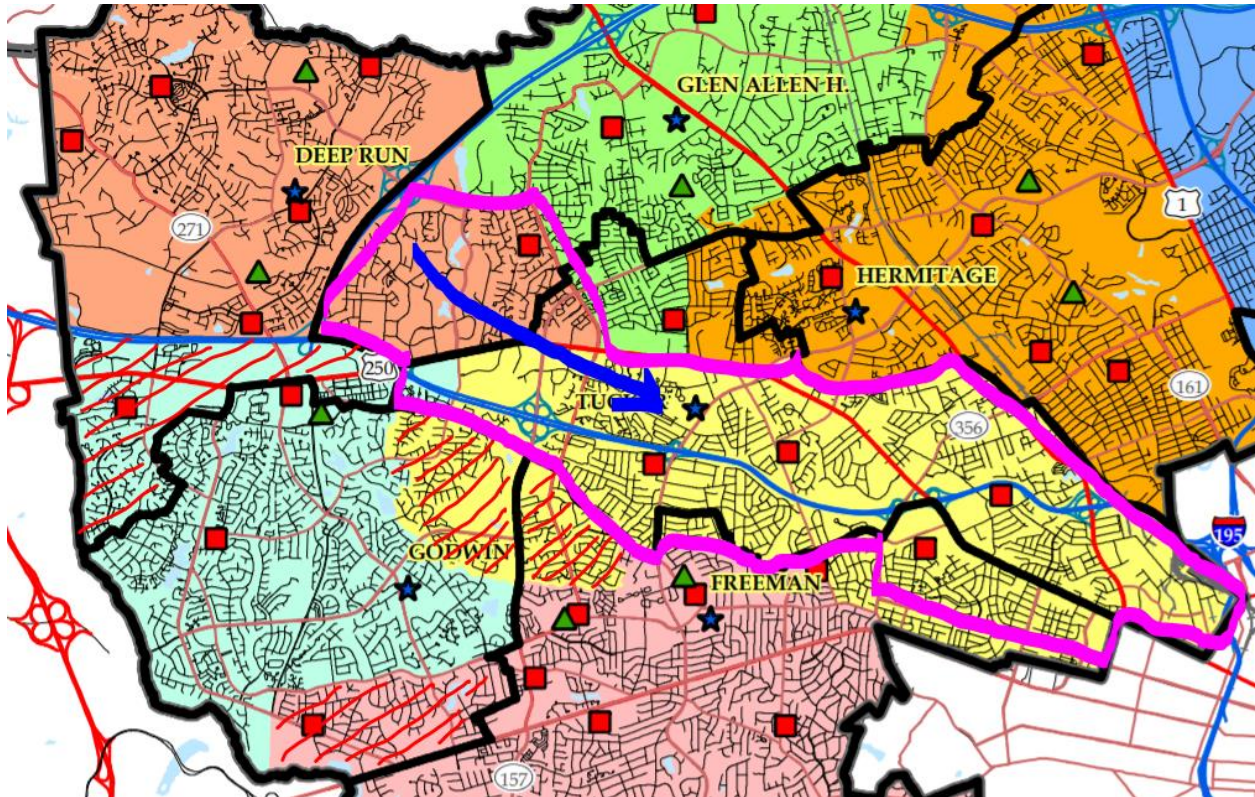


Look at HS Option B. Glen Allen, which faces over-crowding today, is reduced to 81% of capacity – it is a brand new school, why are we allowing it's utilization to drop that much? The answer is because a large segment of Glen Allen is move to Deep Run to backfill Foxhall. Segments of Tucker are moved to Deep Run and to Glen Allen and to Hermitage. That leaves Tucker at low enrollment, and by pushing Canterbury and Kingsley into Freeman, it pushes Crestview and the Pemberton Road corridor into Tucker. Freeman's crowding is reduced, but there is probably a better set of moves that creates less disruption and dissatisfaction.

Look at the number of changes that are pin-wheeling around the West End, avoiding simple moves from Glen Allen and Hermitage. Pity the Cox Road corridor their commute to Deep Run will be horrendous.

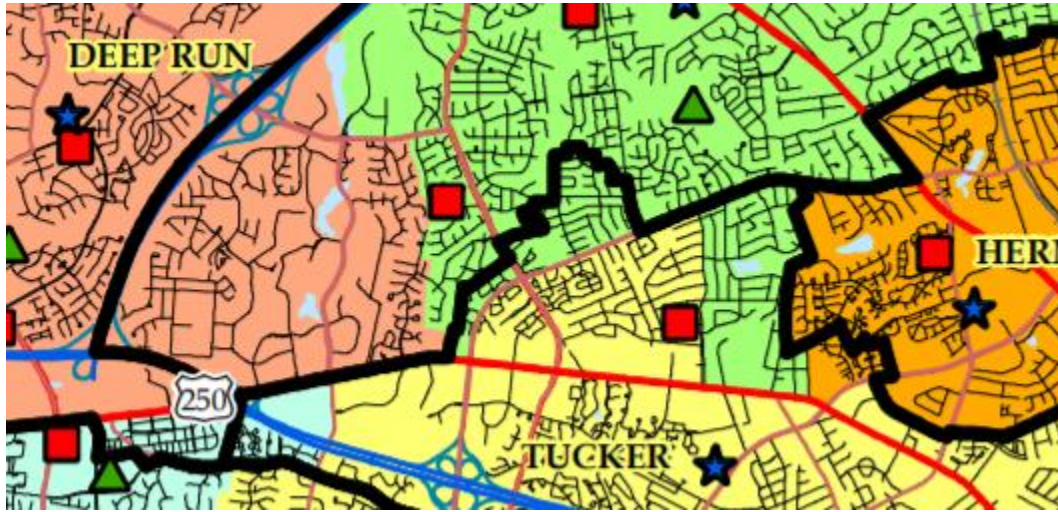


If Godwin HS's boundaries are not changed, Foxhall stays at Deep Run, West Broad Village stays at Deep Run, and the west end of Glen Allen goes to Tucker. This is the area marked with the blue arrow, and is north of Broad Street, bounded by I-295, Nuckols Farm inside of I-295, and Springfield Rd. The newest development areas get the newest school. The older areas get stability. The Freeman capacity issue becomes arbitrage in the Pemberton Corridor and Crestview south of Monument Avenue. There are already small moves between Glen Allen, Hermitage, and Tucker, and final adjustment is what balances enrollment among those schools. Simply stated, Godwin does not need to change, and the changes being imposed on Godwin communities are creating the same pinwheel effect that we pushed back on 10 years ago.

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Chris and Josh,

Thank you both for the information! I did finally find the expected number of students on the redistricting website. I must have overlooked it in the Oct. meeting docs. I had been hearing that the info wasn't available to the committees, hence my concern. Thank you again for responding and sharing the detailed spreadsheet!

Josh - Here are my specific transportation questions:

1. Option B splits Sadler Rd in Innsbrook into two different elementary schools, Rivers Edge and Springfield Park. Are there any transportation issues with buses from two different schools that both start at 7:40am driving on the same small road? **We currently have four buses on Sadler Rd for elementary (Rivers Edge), and do not see the Option B proposed change as an issue.** One set of buses would turn right into neighborhoods along Sadler while the other set would turn left. **We currently turn left into Thorncroft Dr with one Rivers Edge bus. The direction of travel or stop order would not change for either school.** Our preference is to keep all of Sadler Rd at Rivers Edge, so I'm wondering whether or not this is a significant concern of the Transportation Dept, or if it's not worth using as an argument.

2. Both options send Sadler Rd to Short Pump Middle instead of our current school Holman, where we prefer to stay. To get to Short Pump MS, buses would have to:

- Drive on Broad St to Pouncey Tract Rd
- Drive on Nuckols Rd to Pouncey Tract (driving right past Holman)

- Drive on Nuckols Rd to Twin Hickory Rd to Pouncey Tract (driving within 0.5 mi of Holman on Nuckols) This would be the more likely path we would choose. We would redirect the two existing routes to Short Pump Middle. Not much of a change for transportation.

a. Is it true that I'm hearing that the Transportation Dept prefers not to drive buses on Broad St? If so, great! Broad St is highly accident-prone and an inefficient route due to traffic volume. The comment from Transportation at the committee meetings was in regards to the students who reside south of Broad St off of N Gayton and Causeway. Transportation would prefer to not cross Broad St twice. We currently send an empty bus to pick up the students, then cross Broad St again to school (Short Pump MS or Deep Run HS). The reverse is true in the afternoon, as the empty bus goes to the next school. We did not make a comment about not driving on Broad St. The primary concern is the time it takes a school bus to cross Broad St twice waiting on traffic lights.

b. What are the Transportation Dept's thoughts on driving directly past and/or within a half mile of one middle school to get to another middle school? Again, I'm wondering if this is a worthy argument or not. A lot of our school boundaries do not have the school located in the center of the attendance boundary. There are other examples where we drive near another school of the same grade level in transporting students to/from school. Students who reside near Short Pump MS currently attend Holman. Students who reside near Shady Grove Rd & Nuckols (near Holman MS) attend Short Pump MS.

Thank you so much for speaking with me Thursday night at the public info session! It was great to meet you in person and to find out that you share many of the same concerns about the redistricting process.

I talked with Amy Smith for awhile after you left. She suggested that I ask you for a contact person with the Transportation Dept to talk to about bus routes on Sadler Rd. (Is there any point in the process that the Transportation Dept would step in to review the options and say "yes" or "no"? ) I'd like to ask them how the department feels about the potential for buses for 2 elementary schools on that road at the same time and

whether it makes sense to drive Rivers Edge buses past my neighborhood, which could go to Springfield Park. I'm also wondering how they would feel about driving Holman buses past Sadler Rd to get to school, while the buses on Sadler Rd would drive to Short Pump and travel within half a mile of Holman. I don't feel like I can argue against the capacity numbers to keep Sadler Rd at Holman, so I need to focus on transportation and feeder patterns. But if the transportation dept feels there aren't any issues with the above, then maybe there's nothing we can do.

Also, just curious - who would/should be responsible for providing the numbers on future developments? Is that Cropper or the County Board of Supervisors? I feel like if we don't get info about future developments, we'll just be paying Cropper to come back out here in another 4-5 years to do more redistricting. If future developments in the far west end could bring Short Pump MS to capacity, then Sadler Rd would probably get moved back in to Holman again, so why not just keep us there? And why not consider the expansion of Hungary Creek Middle now? The additional capacity there could allow some of the Echo Lake neighborhoods to stay at HCMS, which could in turn allow Sadler Rd to stay at Holman.

So many questions! :) I'm hoping to gather as much info as possible to see if we have any valid arguments that the redistricting committee would consider before I submit the survey. Thank you for any clarifications you can provide! And if you think it would help in any way, I'd really appreciate the contact info for someone in the Transportation Dept.

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Mr. Briggs,

I am a resident of the Fox Hall neighborhood with children in or about to enter the HCPS. I am writing to provide some additional and more detailed feedback on the current redistricting options, after the November 13 gallery walk. I have completed the feedback form, but it is not set up in a manner that captures many of the concerns that Henrico residents have about the current draft options.

The Fox Hall subdivision and the smaller neighborhoods immediately north of it (Graham Meadows, Gayton Station, and Greengate) should remain in Deep Run High School and Short Pump Middle school, and should not end up at Godwin High School (as proposed under current A and B) or Pocahontas Middle School (as proposed under one of the two current options). The reasons are numerous, as set forth below:

1. Transportation/Traffic Issues

Deep Run High School is closer to, and a much more direct drive from, Fox Hall than Godwin High School - 3.2 miles and a straight shot on North Gayton Road/Shady Grove Road to Deep Run, versus 3.6 miles on narrower residential roads with multiple turns to get to Godwin.

The County spent an enormous amount of money on the North Gayton Road expansion a few years ago, which makes both Short Pump Middle School and Deep Run High School easily accessible to Fox Hall for student transportation via this wide, 5 lane major road.

Replacing Fox Hall with areas inside of I-295 for the DRHS district, as proposed by these current draft options A and B, would create traffic/transport issues for these new areas, which would be in and around Innsbrook. This area, and particularly Nuckols Road at 295 which would be the only transport route, is already heavily congested during normal transportation times due to all of the Innsbrook office traffic.

2. Natural Boundaries

The redistricting committees and School Board consider natural boundaries, such as major roads, in order to avoid splitting neighborhoods, to simplify transport, and to alleviate traffic concerns. Both of these current proposals would expand the Deep Run High School District into areas East of I-295, which is the current boundary and also a natural neighborhood and transportation boundary.

Godwin appears already at or slightly over capacity, and Deep Run is a much newer facility that appears to have a bit more room, with the current boundaries. In order to move Fox Hall and its immediately surrounding neighborhoods into Godwin under the current proposals, many current Godwin neighborhoods are being split or moved. We do not want our friends to the South of us, in places like Raintree and Church Run, to be disrupted unnecessarily, particularly when these neighborhoods are much closer to Godwin. Keeping Fox Hall at Deep Run High School (and Short Pump Middle School as its feeder) makes much more sense for the entire Western side of the County.

### 3. Not Moving Communities Repeatedly

Another goal of the redistricting process is to reduce the repeated movement/redistricting of neighborhoods. Fox Hall was just moved from Pocahontas Middle School to Short Pump Middle School within the last 10 years. The proposal that would move it back to Pocahontas would detract from this consideration, and would also be inconsistent with the feeder pattern into Deep Run High School where Fox Hall has been since Deep Run opened in 2002.

I hope that the committees and the board will consider these factors and adjust the proposals accordingly. The stated objectives of the redistricting process can be better achieved by doing so, while also reducing the impact on neighborhoods in both the Three Chopt and Tuckahoe Districts.

Good afternoon,

My name is Angie Allen and I have a third grader and Kindergartner at Jackson Davis Elementary School.

I am writing to express my concerns for *2021 Redistricting*.

For a little background, my husband and I were born and raised in Henrico County, and went through all 13 years of Henrico County Public Schools. Now, we live in Henrico County with our two children who were born and raised here and are currently enrolled in Henrico County Public Schools. I am deeply invested in our school system and am concerned with the redistricting maps.

I live in Oldhouse Run off of Pemberton Road. It was a struggle for me to leave the city of Richmond, as I teach at VCUarts and am involved with many art-related organizations downtown. But, when our second child was born, my husband and I knew that we wanted to raise them in Henrico County, and in Henrico County Public Schools. After moving from the city of Richmond, we chose Oldhouse Run for several reasons, one of them being the elementary school, Jackson Davis. We were impressed with the academics and diversity at Davis.

Oldhouse Run also has the community feel that we desired for our young family. We all get together for cookouts, holidays, and random social gatherings; families have become close and so our children have become best friends.

Looking at the new maps and elementary zoning, both of the options take Oldhouse Run only to Pemberton Elementary, splitting it from Rockstone which is essentially dividing a neighborhood in half. Next door neighbors on Boardman Lane, where our house is located, would literally go to different elementary schools. This obviously would affect our deep sense of community and would be hard on my children, who are incredibly invested in our neighborhood and school.

The Pemberton corridor (referring to neighborhoods off Pemberton Road between Three Chopt and Quioccasin) was shuffled during the last redistricting, 10 years ago when half was moved from Godwin to Freeman. Now that we have adjusted and formed a solid community pulling into Freeman, it appears that the maps are looking at shuffling and splitting us up once again.

My desire to stay at Jackson Davis Elementary further stems from the fact that my daughter is in third grade, and will be "grandfathered in," which is wonderful, but my son is in kindergarten and would then go to Pemberton.

As a working mom, this year has been absolutely game-changing, having both children at one school! Furthermore, I am a VP on the Jackson Davis PTA, and I cannot imagine working a fulltime job and serving on two PTA boards. Again, this is unique to me but I wanted to express it.



I also have included points from research that neighbors have expressed. Please see below, although I am sure you have already heard these before!

Please keep the Pemberton Corridor at Freeman High School!

Just 10 years ago, HCPS redrew and altered school boundaries for the Pemberton Corridor as a way to improve the feeder pattern and bring together the neighborhoods along Pemberton Road. During the 2010 redistricting, the Pemberton Corridor was dramatically impacted by boundary shifts:

- The neighborhoods of Oldhouse Run, Rockstone, Gates Head, Pemberton West, Candlewood, Spring Tree and Quail Run were moved from Godwin High School to Freeman High School.

- The Pinedale Farms neighborhood was moved from Tuckahoe Middle to Byrd Middle (now Quioccasin Middle).

This created a feeder pattern that brought students from both sides of Pemberton Road TOGETHER to attend Quioccasin Middle and Freeman High School. Our current feeder pattern works and has established a strong community along the Pemberton Corridor.

HOWEVER, as Henrico County looks to redraw the 2021 school boundaries there are three options on the table that would move the Pemberton Corridor out of Freeman and into the new Tucker HS zone.

We oppose this move for the following reasons:

1. We JUST went through this 10 years ago when our school boundaries were last changed.
2. The whole point of moving us last time was to create a feeder pattern that fed the Pemberton Corridor to Freeman HS.
3. Every option currently being considered projects enrollment DECLINE for Freeman HS and INCREASE for Tucker HS. Why move the Pemberton Corridor and disrupt our current feeder pattern? Keep us at Freeman.
4. According to Cropper data, the three options that propose moving the Pemberton Corridor out of Freeman HS also have the HIGHEST option impact statistics for students. Every effort should be made to reduce these impacts. (See Options 3, 5 and 6)
5. Moving us would disrupt the continuity and character of our community and take us to a THIRD high school in just 10 years!

As the Redistricting Committee continues to adjust attendance boundaries, we urge you to consider these points and respectfully request to KEEP the Pemberton Corridor at Freeman High School!

All of this is causing much anxiety in our household, neighborhood, and schools. I hope that the committee will consider my points and those of my peers. Thank you for your time and best of luck with all of the work ahead!

### **KEEP PEMBERTON CORRIDOR AT FREEMAN HIGH SCHOOL**

RE: Pinedale Farms Neighborhood

If forced to move to Tucker, many along the Pemberton Corridor will now have two schools outside of their voting magisterial district (Tucker & JDES).

- Freeman is 1.3 miles from Pinedale Farms. Tucker is 2.6 miles along Parham Road with no sidewalks and crosses I-64.
- Our students can walk to Freeman High School!

#### **Enrollment & Utilization**

- HCPS data show that enrollment is trending DOWN at Freeman and UP at Tucker. What's the rationale to move the Pemberton Corridor out of DSF if enrollment is trending down in all scenarios?
- Options A and B arbitrarily move current Tucker students to Glen Allen HS and Hermitage HS even though both schools have LOW utilization rates in each option. Why?
  - Both options pull more than 300 students from Tucker and shift them to Hermitage, Glen Allen and Deep Run HS.
  - Why remove current Tucker students if a goal is to feed Tucker?
- Options A and B pull more than 140 students from Godwin to Freeman.
- If Freeman is already at 100% utilization, why are we ADDING more kids to Freeman just to push out the Pemberton Corridor?
- There are only 142 high school age students along the Pemberton Corridor.
  - That is far less than the number of students being moved from Tucker to Glen Allen and Hermitage combined.
  - It is about the same number of students being pulled from Godwin into Freeman (from Kingsley, Canterbury, Carver district, etc).
- HCPS data show these two options impact thousands of students in the west end JUST to fill the additional 42 seats at the new Tucker HS!
  - Option A impacts 1,472 students
  - Option B impacts 2,094 students → Every effort should be made to limit unnecessary impact to students!
- The maps endorsed by the Redistricting Committee FAIL to limit student impacts and arbitrarily move school boundaries with little regard for established communities or existing feeder patterns.

Thanks, first of all, for the kind and thoughtful message. I am sure you both are receiving many emails this morning around the redistricting meeting last night. I do not envy you both in the tasks that are in front of you. The meeting location last night was unfortunately a horrible decision to host it at a school which is being effected by surrounding high school neighborhoods. I live in the Monumental Floral Gardens (Crestview area) and we are also a large contingency in the crowd last night as well ( not as obnoxious or rude as some folks in the crowd ). I was shocked to see the only publicity by the news organizations were only covering the area at Godwin, there was little to no mention of any other effected areas. Which many Henrico residents throughout the entire county viewed as unfair. Sure, we are all concerned for our children's safety & education and no one wants to move.

My children have been through two renovations of both Crestview and Tuckahoe middle and have been taught in trailers for years. I believe this is something that no one has mentioned and how has this impacted their education thus far? Now we would be asking our children to move after their freshman year into Tucker (from Freeman) to move to a school which no one can guarantee to be 100% completed by the deadline. I predict more construction, trailers and distractions will be in their future. I as a parent, I really am concerned about these distractions and the impacts on college preparation. My children have been with their friends in this feeder pattern since kindergarten. Our children's education is important and it is something that my family will fight for.

I am also scared for the amount of new drivers which would be traveling to and from school on I-64 from our community. Would you as a parent or a driver want a newly licensed child on Glenside road and on the interstate in the a.m.? Look at the map, this would be their route every day. If you drive that route, like I do daily your answer would immediately be no ( cars driving in excessive speeds). Teenagers would drive on the interstate even if it was against what is recommended by their parents(quickest route). The longer alternate route, along Skipwith road would see a huge increase in traffic which also has not been addressed or brought up with those who live along that corridor.

Last but not least, by removing Crestview from Freeman you will see diversity go down along with the number of those in poverty levels which Crestview possesses. I believe that elementary school has over 40% of students are eligible for free or reduced lunch. By removing Crestview, Freeman's diversity would probably be the lowest in the county with white high earning families. If having blended balanced schools are the county & HCPS's mission this would be a huge swing and miss for everyone. I foresee this catapulting into a much bigger issue.

Would the new elementary school and middle school expansion possibly help high schools? Would expanding Deep Run or Glen Allen High also solve these problems? Would building a new high school in the far west-end help?

I believe those of us with 8<sup>th</sup> graders would need to know this sooner rather than later. We want our children starting and finishing at the same high school. Moving them early would be awful for education, friendships, sports teams they play on and not to mention familiarity with their surroundings. If we do not hear about this decision until spring, many families will not have time to purchase(move) to a new home or put in applications at a private schools outside HCPS system. Another question is from the figures presented, none of the current high schools are busting from the seams ( 17-21 kids per class?). What does 100% capacity really mean? My community was targeted last time and we were assured that this would not happen again. This why we remained in our current home. There has to be more options which effect those highly growing communities and areas in the far west-end of the county.

Has delaying or scrapping this whole redistricting process has been looked at? My family loves our home, our community, our friends and neighbors, our small business located around us and our places of worship within walking distance. We chose to live in this community for the school pattern and the diversity it comes with.

I appreciate the work you both do and hope a resolution presents itself which will not affect our well balanced, diverse and safe school pattern. Thank you for the time reading this and the commitment to HCPS and to the county.

Good evening. I'm a bit surprised by your e-mail, I'm sure that the school administration is deeply interested in this project. Have you had a review of the recent proposals? They are unacceptable. Maybe the committee is losing their focus? I assure you these plans do not have the support of my neighborhood. Corrective action is required to maintain our zoning.

You are correct - the school administration is deeply interested in this project. It has a huge long term impact on the division and families. I have no reason to believe that the committee is losing their focus. Redistricting is a long process and involves the inclusion of literally thousands of comments from the community. Over the past couple of months, the committee has worked hard to develop six options that incorporate various comments from the community. Several committee members stated after the meeting last night that the personal interaction and discussions gave them additional insight that will allow them to refine the maps at the next meeting.

It's unacceptable to issue and end the public input sessions one week from issuance. I, like many of my neighbors, work and require time for work schedule modification so our voices can be heard.

The entire redistricting process, including all meetings, has been scheduled and advertised on our website and communicated publicly since the summer. <https://henricoschools.us/redistricting/>

When will the next versions of the plans be available?

Further to our discussion today. Some background. I reached out to the Department of Education with regards to any redistricting requirements. They came back with reviewing school bus routes during a school division redistricting scenario. Please see the email thread below.

We have had Citizen Redistricting Committee (CRC) Members tell us that HCPS Transportation staff indicated that there is a 'hard boundary' at Broad Street for Pump Road and N. Gayton Road. CRC Members indicated to myself and neighbors that due to the above statements they selected options that push current Deep Run HS and Short Pump MS students (areas south of Broad Street) into Godwin HS and Pocahontas MS. Meanwhile, these options then push our children much further away into Tucker HS and Quioccasin MS. Our children would now have to travel longer distances, on busier roads, in the direction of rush hour traffic, through the higher volume Gaskins Road/Three Chopt Road Intersection (that is effectively tied into the ramps for the I-64/Gaskins Rd Interchange), AND more accidents. Bottom line, we are highly concerned with regards to safety of our children.

During the discussion this evening, your HCPS Transportation staff advised that they suggested during the CRC meetings as to a boundary along West Broad Street due to bus "efficiency". Based on my 30-years of experience in the field of transportation engineering, I would disagree with the efficiency of the new routes and think the routes also appear to be less safe. You can see some of my discussion on page Page 8 of the attachment. Using Pages 15 and 16, I completed a review of likely routes, distances from student catchment areas to schools, average daily traffic volumes, direction of rush hour traffic on routes, accident clusters, intersections, and interchanges. To me, the potential bus routes seem less efficient and less safe for the affected areas of Deep Run HS, Short Pump MS, Godwin HS, Pocahontas MS, Tucker HS and Quioccasin MS. I would be more than happy to sit down with your staff and more thoroughly review and discuss.

My profession has been making huge advancements in data science, GIS, multi-objective analysis, linear reference systems for roadways, automatic routing systems, etc. I know we could easily use traffic data on GIS layers and use purely objective methods with appropriate criteria that would quantitatively show the relative safety of bus route options.

From the state level, Virginia doesn't have any specific transportation code concerning public school division redistricting. Below is the public school transportation code concerning school bus routes that normally would be affected in a school division redistricting scenario. I've also included the link to Chapter 70. Regulations Governing Pupil Transportation for your reference.

#### **8VAC20-70-160. Review of Routes.**

School bus routes, school sites, and safety of pupils at designated school bus stops shall be reviewed at least once a year and as changes occur. Routes shall be reviewed for safety hazards, fuel conservation, and to assure the most efficient use of buses. Local school administrators shall evaluate the safety of pupils at bus stops periodically and shall at the request of the local school board report the results annually to the school board. Hazardous or unusual situations, to include railway crossings, shall be marked on the route sheet and made available to drivers and substitutes.

A written vehicular and pedestrian traffic control plan for each existing school site shall be reviewed annually for safety hazards. All new school site plans shall include provisions that promote vehicular and pedestrian safety.

I know allot of you either don't live in the 'hood anymore or all your kids are out of Henrico County PS, however, we really need your support.

We have been slotted, yet again to be moved for Middle School and High School in both "plans" from PMS to Quioccasin and in both plans from Godwin to Tucker.

I am beyond disappointed that:

- The county is spending 6 figures on this exercise - **AGAIN** - when the last time was to have been the last time.
- I believe this might be the fourth redistricting Church Run has endured since we moved here in 1999. At least the decision made in 2009 was logical.
- The School board should be spending this money getting better teachers and rebranding the Tucker Specialty center if they really want to improve the diversity there.
- We could use that money to pay more for our teachers or at least make it so they don't have to provide their own supplies in the classroom.

I did not include in my email my request to contact committee members directly because I realized that would not be appropriate. I realized the committee members have a difficult and time consuming task for which they have volunteered and the current process was set up with efficiency in mind.

Unfortunately, I am getting into the details late in the process. When we had six options there was 16.67% chance of our neighborhoods being rezoned for high school. When the 2 options were announced, there is 100% chance of rezoning.

What is the best way for me to understand how we went from 16.67% chance of being redistricted to 100%?

We have several neighborhoods that are concerned about the issue and we are coordinating our efforts. Any information I receive will be disseminated to the others so to minimize requests for information.

We have filled out the appropriate online surveys, but wanted to reach out to you directly, as it is unclear what information will or will not get through to each member of the redistricting committee.

**Both proposal A and proposal B are contrary to your stated guidelines for redistricting and not in the best interest of the students.**

Students can currently walk or bike to their local school, and instead the proposal suggests bussing them to Tucker which is a 4 mile bus ride, in addition to dividing an existing established neighborhood which has been an incorporated Association since 1972.

Some of the stated redistricting guidelines are:

**1) To maintain the concept of geographic zoning which encourages the participation and involvement of geographically contiguous communities with a school.**

Raintree is one of the first planned communities in Henrico. It is an existing established neighborhood which has been an incorporated Association since 1972. It, by definition, meets the criteria of a **geographically contiguous community**. Therefore, ALL of Raintree should be zoned to Godwin.

**2) Major roads and natural boundaries will be used whenever feasible as zone lines.**

The Raintree subdivision is bordered by Gaskins, Ridgefield, Pump and Gayton Roads. The proposal breaks off a portion of the community and ignores the natural boundaries and major roads.

Therefore, all of Raintree should be zoned to Godwin.

**4) Efforts will be made to establish walking schools and reasonable walking zones.**

We are within less than a MILE of Godwin High School, clearly within walking distance. Tucker is 4 miles from our community and NOT within walking distance. Bussing students who are within walking distance is a waste of resources, time and money.

Therefore, all of Raintree should be zoned to Godwin.

**The NUMBERS do not support this redistricting effort either.**

In option A, it would reduce the student population at Godwin by 12 students. Option B would reduce the population of Godwin by 39. Both of these options change the overall usage of the school by a negligible difference (1-2%), while creating massive upheaval for many families, as well as creating new bussing requirements and extra time and resources diverted to this new bussing requirement.

2) Freeman is currently at 100 +% capacity. Tucker is currently at 86% capacity with a planned increased footprint. These 2 schools are in closer proximity than Godwin and it's feeder neighborhoods are to either of those schools, and simply moving one or two neighborhoods currently attending Freeman over to Tucker would solve both the overpopulation at Freeman and the under-usage of Tucker without the massive disruption to the lives of so many families and students.

3) Raintree is less than 1 mile from Godwin. There is no room for expansion or new construction to this long established neighborhood. While population may vary slightly from year to year, the changes are relatively stable and easily absorbed into the current Godwin student population.

Hello Committee!

This is a reminder that our first Public Information Session is scheduled for this Thursday, November 7th at Wilder Middle School. The presentation starts at 6:30pm, but **we are asking the committee to arrive at 6pm if possible for a brief orientation as well as you seeing the layout.** We will give each committee member a colored lanyard. Elementary members will have a yellow lanyard and middle/high members will have an orange one.

I know that many of you are nervous about this event as you don't feel you can answer detailed questions about each specific move/area on the map. You shouldn't be expected to know every in/out of the map. You will do fine, and most of the conversation will be explaining how someone may be impacted, or they will already know how they are impacted and want to discuss their concerns. If anyone asks what the rationale is for any move on the map, I always go through the following thoughts:

1. Is the school currently overcrowded? Have adjustments given them capacity relief?
2. Is the school adjacent to them overcrowded? It is possible (more likely) that adjustments were made in a region to help balance utilization.
3. Is there an imbalance in utilization of adjacent schools? A move could have been made to make them more equitable.
4. Is there a current imbalance in feeder patterns? It is possible that an adjustment was made to bring feeder patterns more into balance.
5. Does the current zone have transportation weaknesses, such as crossing over a major road or not attending school closest to their home? It's possible that adjustments were made to better align with transportation patterns and make this more efficient.

It is most likely that as you explore any particular area in question, you will see that the answer/rationale for a move involves a combination of these factors.

We are bringing DRAFT Options A and B to this upcoming session. For Elementary, Option A was built using ES Option 5, and Option B was built using ES Option 6. For the secondary schools, Option A was built using MS/HS Option 5, and Option B was built using MS/HS Option 3. We did make some slight adjustments to the zones to fix some of the small feeder pattern splits, but changes weren't extensive.

The most important part of this week, is to remind everyone (and I will as well) that these maps are DRAFTS and these maps are very likely to be modified and/or new maps created off of these. These 2 map series' are merely the 2 best that you felt adhered to the overall objectives and guiding principles at the point of these upcoming sessions, but you know that there is still work to be done.

We plan to make these materials live to the public (as well as updating the online map) early this week prior to 11/7, but wanted to give you an early look at the information.

A few other notes/follow-up. A few of you have asked me about an article in the news that identifies a 2nd elementary school in the capital plan, and why isn't that included in our work. As I stated in an email last week, HCPS has identified a new Elementary School and a Middle School Expansion, which we will have to incorporate into our planning work. These options this week will not include any changes to account for the new ES or the MS expansion. The 2nd elementary school does not have an identified timeline and it will not be part of our work. So a 2nd elementary school will NOT be part of our focus for this effort. There has been mention of the middle school expansion going in at Hungary Creek MS, but that decision has not yet been made final so I consider this still TBD.

These 2 public info sessions (11/7 and 11/13) will be emotional and there will be some heated discussions around the maps. I just encourage you to stay focused on encouraging each member of the public to look through the same lens that we are, and provide constructive input as it relates to adherence to the guiding principles and objectives. We must stay focused on making data driven decisions, and keep all bias and emotion out of it.

Thanks again for all of your hard work and commitment to this process. I look forward to seeing all of you this week!

I am writing to let you know I strongly oppose both options A and B as they both have a tiny portion of my subdivision, RAINTREE, leaving Godwin and being moved to Tucker. My house is less than one mile to Godwin and my child walks to and from school on a regular basis. Moving students to a school that is 4.4 miles away is careless and costly and goes against the guideline set forth by the county of keeping students at a school they are within walking distance of. In addition the guidelines clearly state to not divide any subdivisions. The creek that runs through Raintree which is being used as a dividing line to split the subdivision is not a natural boundary. It is a vital part of our neighborhood with paths and bridges which were strategically placed for residents to use which includes students who use them for walking to Godwin. Therefore another guideline the county is not adhering to is the one of not splitting a subdivision, which options a and b clearly do. The amount of students being taken from Raintree who go to Godwin is so small it would not affect enrollment at Godwin. How could the committee even think about taking students who live within walking distance of school out of that school?? This does not make sense! Pulling part of a neighborhood out of a school that it clearly borders and has been part of since it was built is unreal. HCPS needs to rethink both options a and come up with ones that make more sense.

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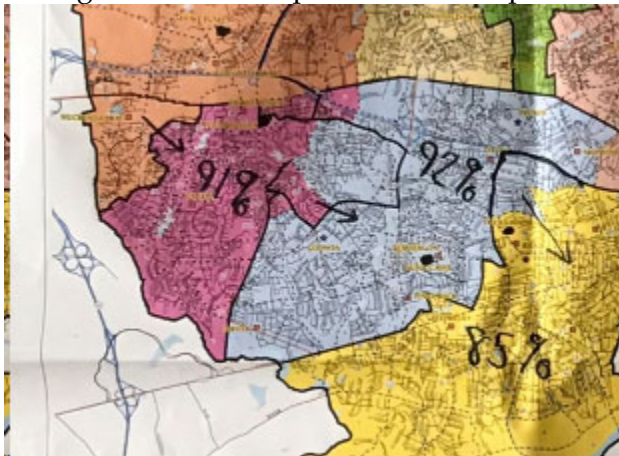

1. Option A was built off of Option 5, but included the changes to Option 5 that the committee made during the Oct. 21 & 23 meetings. So for example, as seen below, the subdivision Fox Hall was moved during the committee process on the Option 5 map and therefore that is reflected in Option A:



2. In Option A, all students who are zoned to Short Pump MS are zoned to attend Deep Run HS, so there is no split as discussed below. See the table below that shows the feeder patterns:

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Mr. Pritchard,

Thanks for your response. Something else you may want to get to the committees and to Cropper GIS is a discrepancy between their presentation, and what is actually shown on current draft Option A.

In reviewing the Powerpoint presentation for the 11/13 gallery walk which is now on the redistricting website, page 18 shows the elementary and secondary committees' preferences, and shows how the options were narrowed from 6 to 2. It appears that original draft option 5 was the consensus as the best one overall taking both committees into account. The presentation slide 18 states that current Option A is supposed to reflect original draft option 5, but Option A removes all neighborhoods south of Broad (including Fox Hall) from the Deep Run district. Original draft option 5 did not do this, and kept the southern portion of the DRHS district unchanged from its current boundary.

I am hoping this was simply an error or oversight, but I plan to raise this discrepancy between Option 5 and Option A at the gallery walk on Wednesday. Option A as currently shown would also result in our kids (Fox Hall and a couple smaller surrounding neighborhoods) being the only ones who attend Short Pump Middle School but not Deep Run High School, which makes little sense.

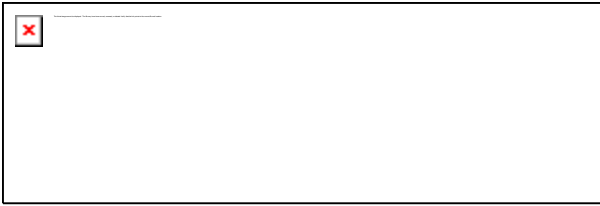

Many parents in Fox Hall are deeply concerned as well. I am a parent of a current Nuckols Farm Elementary student and live in Fox Hall. The County initially had six draft options, four of which kept our children in the Deep Run High School district. Fox Hall has always been a part of Deep Run since the school opened (and vice versa), and Fox Hall residents deeply value this relationship.

The County has now narrowed the options to two (A and B), both of which would move Fox Hall to Godwin. These options would remove Fox Hall from Deep Run, while instead pushing the current Deep Run boundary well East of I-295. These proposed boundaries make little sense, as I-295 is a natural barrier for both neighborhoods and transportation. Based upon the statistics from the prior six options, as well as current enrollments, moving Fox Hall to Godwin would also put Godwin at or near full capacity (in a 40-year-old facility), whereas leaving the Deep Run boundaries largely unaltered would balance the enrollments. Current Godwin families, such as those in Church Run, are also very troubled by the shift that would put all neighborhoods south of 64/Broad into Godwin, pushing others into Freeman.

Fox Hall was also just redistricted from Pocahontas Middle School to Short Pump Middle School, about 10 years ago. One of the current draft options would move us back to Pocahontas again, which is disruptive and unnecessary. The other option would keep Fox Hall and Nuckols Farm students at Short Pump Middle School, but then they would be the only students at Short Pump Middle who would not go on to attend Deep Run High School. Neither of these options is acceptable.

Fox Hall would greatly appreciate your support and assistance in ensuring that our neighborhood remains part of the Deep Run High School community.

Our neighborhoods just went through this redistricting process 10 years ago to establish the current feeder pattern which brought the neighborhoods on either side of Pemberton together. There was a dramatic impact at that time; on the middle school for some and the high school for many. There was a HUGE impact on families. We JUST went through these changes. **Keep us at Freeman to allow this recently established feeder pattern to continue. It was good seeing you at the Public Information Session last week. I appreciated you discussing my concerns. I never received a response to my last email which is discouraging.

Now, no good deed goes unpunished. I still have concerns HCPS generally subverting the "HCPS Policy and Guidelines for Redistricting" especially as compared to the "HCPS Goals" for the Study. Some examples are below.

1) I have seen the "HCPS Goals" described as Goals and Project Objectives in various communications.

2) The "HCPS Policy and Guidelines for Redistricting" sometimes follow but are incorrectly described only as "criteria" and this includes the presentation and handout at the public meeting. The "HCPS Policy and Guidelines for Redistricting" are **THE** "policy", "Guidelines" and "Objectives" for redistricting. So, as a minimum, they should be described as policy objectives. HCPS should clearly state in all presentations that these are the "HCPS Policy and Guidelines for Redistricting" and that they supersede the "Project Goals" in # 1.

3) MOST emails from HCPS on 2021 Redistricting Effort do even mention "HCPS Policy and Guidelines for Redistricting"

4) Dates associated with HCPS Redistricting website are below.

- November 6, 2019: The more visible version of the HCPS Policy and Regulations for Redistricting were removed from the website; however the Redistricting Goals remain in prominent form.
- October 15, 2019: We re-stated our original request for a more visible version and it was partially accommodated.
- October 10, 2019: A tiny link to the HCPS Policy and Regulations for Redistricting was finally added to the redistricting website after we made several requests to HCPS.
- Prior to the above date, the HCPS Policy and Regulations for Redistricting were only embedded in some of the presentations. Only the Goals are mentioned in the introductory video and email communications from HCPS going all the way back to June 2019.
- HCPS has also consistently refused to make any clarification between the Project Goals and the HCPS Policy and Regulations for Redistricting.

Again, the above another layer of confusion and de-emphasis of the "HCPS Policy and Guidelines for Redistricting". In all my work in public consultation, it is absolutely critical to have one set of simple goals or objectives; and the "HCPS Policy and Guidelines for Redistricting" do just that. HCPS could easily lead with the "HCPS Policy and Guidelines for Redistricting" and add a footnote something like as follows:

*"The 2021 HCPS Redistricting study was initiated due to, and will need to address the new capacity of, the expanded Holliday Elementary School and increased capacity for the replaced Highland Springs High School and J. R. Tucker High School. Where possible, efforts will be made to reduce concentrations of poverty while balancing a community or neighborhood school concept."*

Given that HCPS has not responded to my earlier email, I am now forced to make a respectful freedom of information request on the items below including any internal communications with HCPS staff or the GIS consultant on this matter. I would be more than happy to discuss this request with



you; and am aiming for a more transparent and clear set of redistricting goals presented to the Citizen Committee and the public.

- 1) Why does HCPS not see it necessarily to place "HCPS Policy and Guidelines for Redistricting" on all communications regarding the 2021 HCPS Redistricting project?
- 2) Why does HCPS not provide clear clarification between the "HCPS Policy and Guidelines for Redistricting" and the "HCPS Project Goals".
- 3) Why does HCPS not provide a statement that the "HCPS Project Goals" are subordinate to the "HCPS Policy and Guidelines for Redistricting"?
- 4) Please provide the Questions to potential Redistricting Committee members to see if it leaned towards members bias or a lack of skill set for redistricting.
- 5) What criteria was used for the selection of the Redistricting Committee members. Was a rubric used? Also, who made the selection.

I do not know if you recall, but you once helped us out with our 504 Plan with our daughter. We greatly appreciated your help. We need to have our daughter in the most stable school environment possible. We believe the "HCPS Policy and Guidelines for Redistricting" include very reasonable and logical guidelines, procedures and objectives that help with this. We do not see the need for the Redistricting Project Goals and they just add confusion. Also, please also provide clear explanation and guidance of how the highly advertised Goals by HCPS versus Procedural Guidelines are being accommodated jointly and/or separately. The above critical in terms of a clear set of transparent set of criteria be provided to the Consultant, Committee and public.

Many of the options for my and the surrounding subdivisions appear to be have significant impacts that are devoid of the complying with the HCPS Redistricting Procedural Guidelines. We need some clarification of the objectives of this effort.

The School Board has initiated a community-based, comprehensive redistricting study to meet four goals:

1. Efficiently using all available space and planning for future county growth.
  2. Determining attendance boundaries for the expanded Holladay Elementary School (7300 Galaxie Road), this will double in size when an addition opens for the 2021-22 school year.
  3. Accounting for the increased building capacity available when replacements for Highland Springs (15 S. Oak Ave.) and J. R. Tucker (2910 Parham Rd.) high schools open on their current sites for the 2021-22 school year.

4. Reducing concentrations of poverty while balancing a neighborhood or community school concept.

  - All reasonable efforts should be made to ensure contiguous geographic zones which minimize division of clearly identifiable community components (e.g. apartment units, residential subdivisions).
  - All legal and judicial guidelines for the maintenance of a unitary school system will be strictly adhered to.
  - Efforts will be made to establish walking schools and reasonable walking zones where feasible.
  - Efforts will be made to ensure an efficient system of school bus transportation.
  - Provisions should be made to ensure the continuity of a child's K-12 progress. This may be accomplished by offering older students in a school the option to remain at an existing school if parents provide transportation.
  - Implementation of a rezoning plan over a span of several years would be preferable if it has the effect of minimizing the need for additional line changes for a community in the near or immediate future. (Possibility of phasing in certain changes to avoid additional changes when new school construction is completed.)

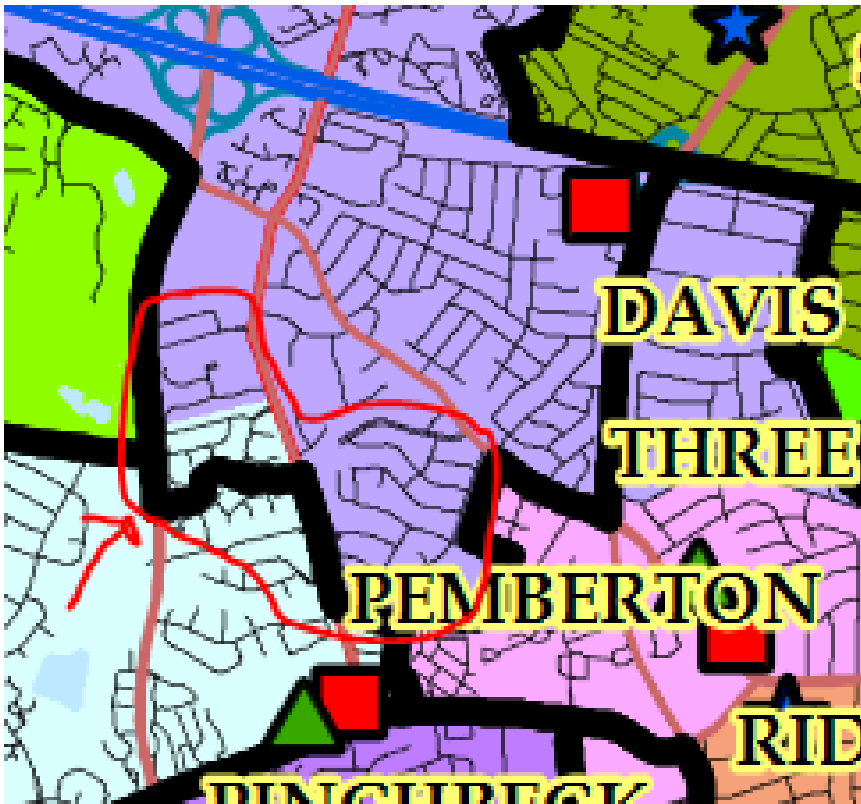

I, as well as others from the above listed neighborhoods, will continue to email and contact each of you on a consistent basis until the committee draws up a suitable plan that begins to address our concerns.

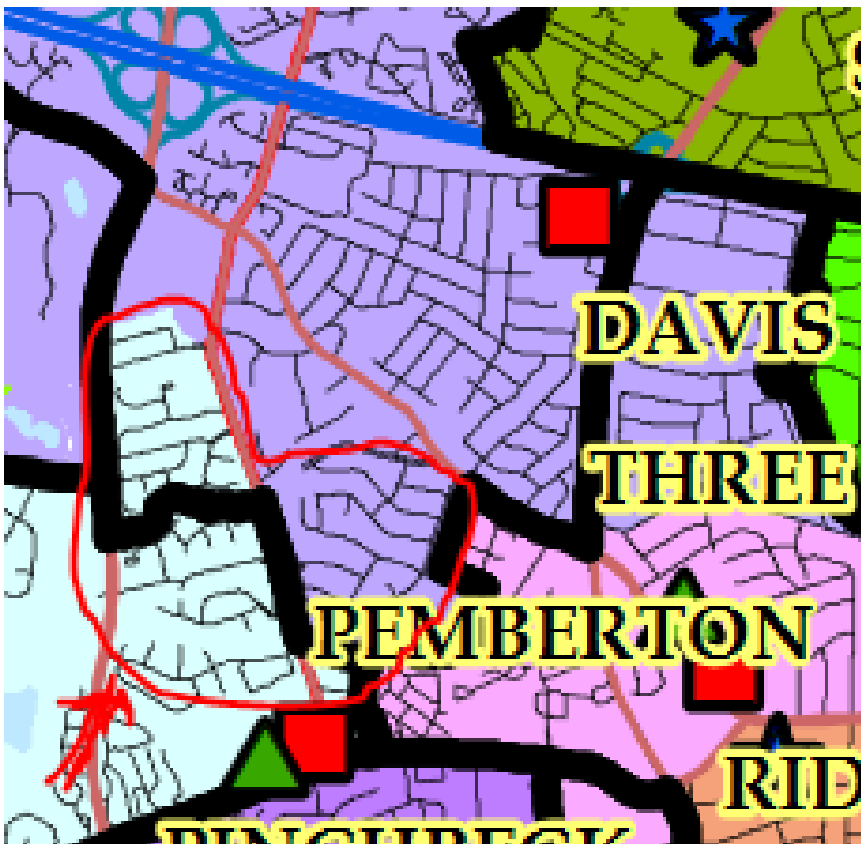

Elementary Option B- Old House Run, Rockstone, Quail Run all left out of JDES and is going to Pemberton

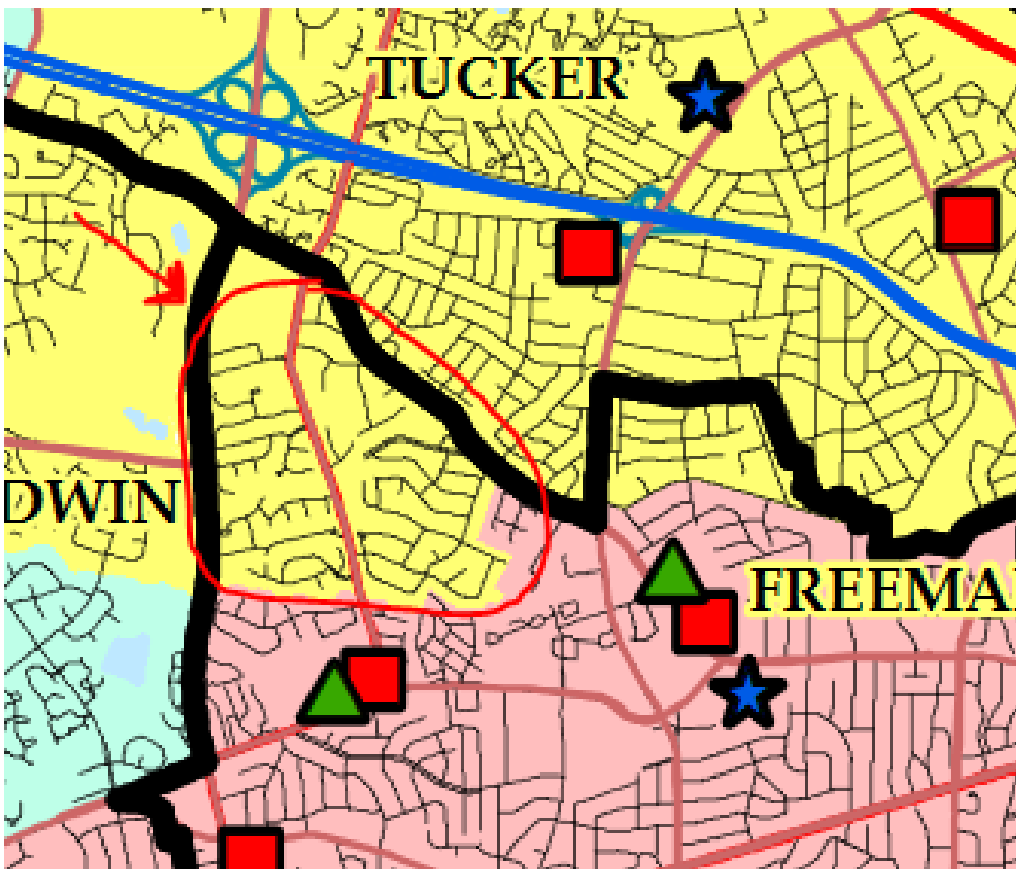

During the 2010 redistricting, the Pemberton Corridor was dramatically impacted by boundary shifts:

- The neighborhoods of Oldhouse Run, Rockstone, Gates Head, Pemberton West, Candlewood, Spring Tree and Quail Run were moved from Godwin High School to Freeman High School.
- The Pinedale Farms neighborhood was moved from Tuckahoe Middle to Byrd Middle (now Quioccasin Middle).

This created a feeder pattern that brought students from both sides of Pemberton Road TOGETHER to attend Quioccasin Middle and Freeman High School. Our current feeder pattern works and has established a strong community along the Pemberton Corridor.

HOWEVER, as Henrico County looks to redraw the 2021 school boundaries there are three options on the table that would move the Pemberton Corridor out of Freeman and into the new Tucker HS zone.

We oppose this move for the following reasons:

1. We JUST went through this 10 years ago when our school boundaries were last changed.
2. The whole point of moving us last time was to create a feeder pattern that fed the Pemberton Corridor to Freeman HS.
3. Every option currently being considered projects enrollment DECLINE for Freeman HS and INCREASE for Tucker HS. Why move the Pemberton Corridor and disrupt our current feeder pattern? Keep us at Freeman.
4. According to Cropper data, the three options that propose moving the Pemberton Corridor out of Freeman HS also have the HIGHEST option impact statistics for students. Every effort should be made to reduce these impacts. (See Options 3, 5 and 6)
5. Moving us would disrupt the continuity and character of our community and take us to a THIRD high school in just 10 years!

As the Redistricting Committee continues to adjust attendance boundaries, we urge you to consider these points and respectfully request to **KEEP the Pemberton Corridor at Freeman High School!**

I'm sending this email as a concerned Henrico country citizen and as a resident of the Pinedale Farms community. I've looked into the two proposed redistricting plans publicly available for the new Tucker High School and I am adamantly opposed to both offerings. My reasons are as follows:

The location. Pinedale Farms is 1.3 miles from Freeman High School, the current high school, but is 2.6 miles from Tucker High School. This would double the commute our families and students take. For those students who walk to and from school this would redirect their walk along a more heavily traveled road than Three Chopt with woefully inadequate provisions for pedestrian traffic.

The community. Pinedale Farms had a school change with the prior redistricting a decade ago. In that time our children and parents have formed bonds and relationships with the teachers and staff at Freeman. And both plans appear to split our neighborhood. Having gone through a similar redistricting in my former home in Chesterfield County when I was a student I feel that neither scenario is acceptable.

Enrollment. Freeman does not have the overcrowding issues that Tucker has. It would be irresponsible to add to the overpopulation of the new high school because it would be detrimental to the education of the students attending.

Boundaries. Redistricting our community to Tucker creates issues with our families and our students commuting along such a heavily-traveled road like Parham. I've addressed some of these issues above. In addition the new Wawa on the corner of Three Chopt and Parham is going to create more traffic issues for our families and students to slog through. I'll grant the location will also affect the families and students as the district lines currently are but not to the degree the new proposals will.

It is my hope that you will abandon both of these proposals and leave this district as it currently stands.

My name is Yael Levin-Sheldon and I was one of the speakers at the 10/24/19 Henrico School Board Meeting. I live in the Greenwood Glen subdivision, but I speak on behalf of Greenwood Glen, Magnolia Ridge, and River Mill subdivisions.

We have presented our concerns to the school board. The number of signatures on our petition has increased and will continue to increase as we raise awareness to the negative impact the proposed redistricting will have on our children. Here is a link to our updated petition <http://chnng.it/6VRwg5bNzm>. We ask that you please read it. Our arguments are iron clad.

Several of us have met with Dr. Barlett, the principal of Brookland Middle School on 10/29/19, and I plan on arranging a similar meeting with the principal of Hermitage High School.

When Dr. Barlett gave us a tour of Brookland Middle, he showed us two trailers that were being utilized on their open campus. We asked why they needed to utilize trailers. Dr. Barlett said that even though technically the school is under capacity, they do not have enough space to accommodate the number of students they have. He also said that while he would welcome any additional students from the redistricting, adding more students will spread their already lacking resources even thinner. We were very impressed with Dr. Barlett. He is innovative and dedicated. He has a student body with 73% economically disadvantaged students and the problems that come with being economically disadvantaged. He has improved the school tremendously in the five years he has been there. However, it is obvious that adding students to Brookland Middle will make his job more difficult and will negatively impact the success he has already been able to achieve and the success of his students.

The day before we met with Dr. Barlett, I was interviewed on air by The Jeff Katz Show on WRVA Richmond. Here is the link to that interview <https://newsradiowrva.radio.com/blogs/jeff-katz/parents-unhappy-henrico-schools-redistricting-plan>. Later today I will be speaking with Channel 8 News about the redistricting, and we are confident additional media outlets will want to speak with us.

You have the ability to ask the school board to table this redistricting. Waiting for the new elementary school by River Mill and for the expansion of the Brookland District middle school makes more sense. For this reason and the points we list in our petition, we believe the county needs to focus on planning rather than uprooting the lives of our children. We also believe the county should provide more resources to struggling schools rather than add more students to already struggling schools. In addition, now that we have met with Dr. Barlett, we realize even more how imperative it is for the school board to really listen to input from the principals of the schools that will be impacted by this redistricting.

Lastly, in the least, we would like you and the school board to update the guidelines to ensure that students will be able to finish in the school they started. As of now, my 5<sup>th</sup> grader will have to do 6<sup>th</sup> grade at Hungary Creek Middle and then switch to Brookland Middle for 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade. I am sure we can agree that it is not in the best interest of students to begin in one school and switch to another school, especially when it comes to middle school.

## Elementary to Middle Feeder Pattern

Concern: With Option B, Sadler Road becomes a boundary for Springfield Park Elementary.

Option B estimated enrollment at SPES: 637

Students attending SPES who are zoned for Short Pump Middle: 62

**Impact: <10% of Springfield Park ES students sent to Short Pump MS, while 90% go to Holman.**

**Request:** Please keep all of Sadler Rd at Rivers Edge.

## Capacity at Short Pump MS and Holman MS

**Concern:** Both options were created using enrollment from 2018-19, the only data available at the time. The 2019-20 enrollment numbers were just released, and the utilization at Holman Middle and at Short Pump Middle are both different from last year.

Last year, Holman was at 94% utilization.

This year, Holman has declined and is currently under capacity at 89% utilization.

Last year, Short Pump was under capacity at 79%.

This year, Short Pump has increased and is still under capacity, but at a higher 86%.

For Holman, Options A and B both lower the utilization to 82% and 81% respectively.

For Short Pump, Option A lowers the utilization to 75%, but Option B raises it to 86%.

**Concern:** The utilization numbers for the options do not consider any expected additional students. Below are the enrolled AND expected students (per the redistricting documentation) for each school for both options and how the utilizations change.

(For example, for Holman Option A: 871 enrolled + 21 expected = 892 => 892 / 1058 = 84%)

**Impact:** Short Pump Middle is expected to be close to or significantly over capacity (**106%**) in the very near future. When that happens, the Sadler Rd neighborhoods would be rezoned back to lower-capacity Holman. Furthermore, per the redistricting documentation, the enrollment trends for Holman are declining.

**Request:** Please keep Sadler Rd at Holman to avoid rezoning again in the near future.

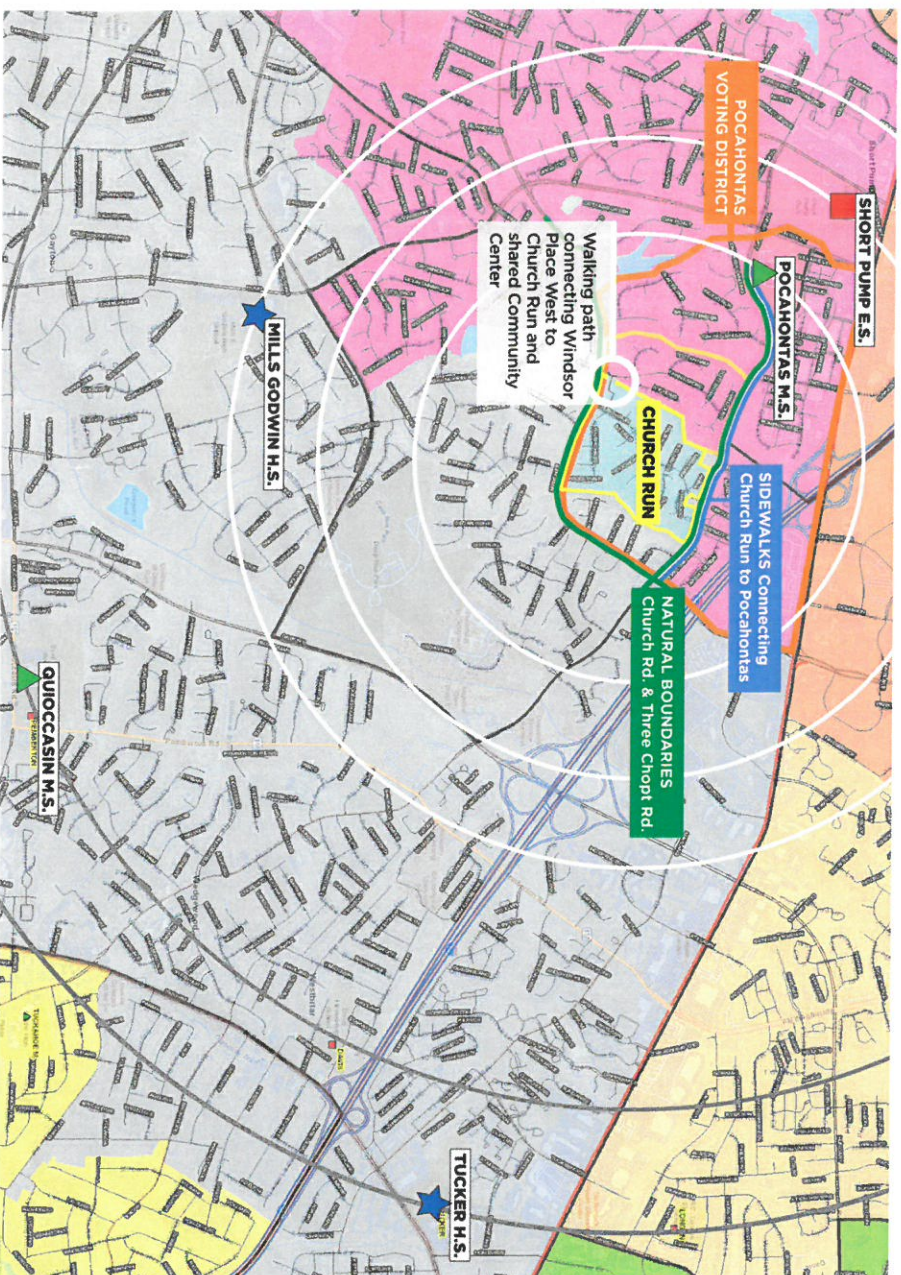

## K-12 Safety & Continuity For Our Community



The yellow outlined areas represent the Church Run and Windsor Place West neighborhoods with an adjoining walking path; the orange line indicates the Pocahontas voting district; the blue line indicates sidewalks connecting Church Run to Pocahontas MS; the green line indicates the natural boundaries of Church Rd. and Three Chopt Rd. We suggest that this area remain in the Pocahontas MS and Godwin HS districts.

- **Maintain transportation safety.** Church Run K-12 children already face risks for bus, youth driver, and/or car rider accidents. Our close proximity to our current schools mitigates that risk. Tripling distance and increasing high traffic routes as well as 4-way/t-intersections are not acceptable options.
- **Utilize Henrico's design for a pedestrian community.** Henrico's Three Chopt Road expansion project includes a double sidewalk leading straight from our neighborhood to Pocahontas MS. Church Run would like the opportunity to utilize the County's measures to increase road safety and create a pedestrian community.
- **Maintain consistency with government lines.** Pocahontas MS is Church Run's voting precinct, which speaks to its close proximity and the school being a fixture of our community.
- **Keep family reunification efficient.** During emergencies, more than tripling our children's distance from school hampers emergency management and family reunification.
- **Keep communities united.** Church Run and Windsor Place West have adjoining walkways and a shared recreation center. The small creek visible on some maps is NOT a boundary; Three Chopt and Church Roads are more appropriate boundaries (see the green lines). Our united communities should not be separated.

Raintree Residents are marching in protest of the proposed 2021 redistricting which would split Henrico's first planned community into 2 high school zones -Godwin and Tucker.

This breaks the counties own redistricting guidelines and criteria and forces many who can currently walk to Godwin to bus several miles across Interstate 64 to Tucker HS. Additionally, these changes provide negligible change in enrollment at Godwin.

1) HCPS Redistricting Committee is not following its own stated guidelines and criteria for redistricting. The plans break 4 of the county's own **redistricting criteria**:

**I. Major roads and natural boundaries will be used to define attendance zones.**

- The Raintree subdivision is bordered by Gaskins, Ridgefield, Pump and Gayton Roads. The proposal breaks off a portion of the community and ignores the natural boundaries and major roads.

**II. Efforts will be made to establish walking zones.**

- Raintree subdivisions less than 1 mile from Godwin HS.

**III. Ensure efficient transportation.**

- Students who can currently walk or bike now must ride a bus crossing major roads and highways.

**IV. Ensure contiguous geographic zones which minimize division of clearly identifiable community components (apartment units, subdivisions)**

- Raintree is one of the first planned communities in Henrico, Associated in 1972. It is an **identifiable community** and by definition, meets the criteria of a **geographically contiguous community**.

2) The numbers do not support either option A or B as it pertains to Godwin HS and Raintree.

- Redistricting benefit would be minimal resulting in a 1-2% change in enrollment in an established neighborhood with a stable population base and no planned new construction a growth
- Census Reports show that Option A would remove 12 students from the Godwin population, while Option B would remove 39 students (across elementary, middle and high school)

### Feeder Pattern

- We wish to preserve the feeder pattern that was just created 10 years ago (2010) during the last redistricting.
- At that time, the School Board voted to move students from TMS to QMS – and move students from Godwin to Freeman.
- The last redistricting brought together both sides of Pemberton Rd to attend QMS and DSF together. Previously the Corridor had been split.
- We support preserving the community the Pemberton Corridor has established at QMS and Freeman HS.
- We support protecting the continuity of education and developed relationships among students/families along the Pemberton Corridor.
- **If Option A or B are approved, this would be the 3<sup>rd</sup> high school for the Pemberton Corridor in just 10 years! (Godwin – Freeman – Tucker)**

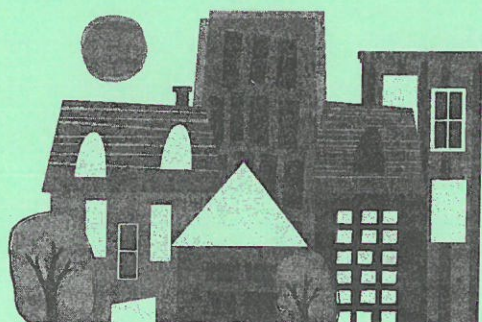

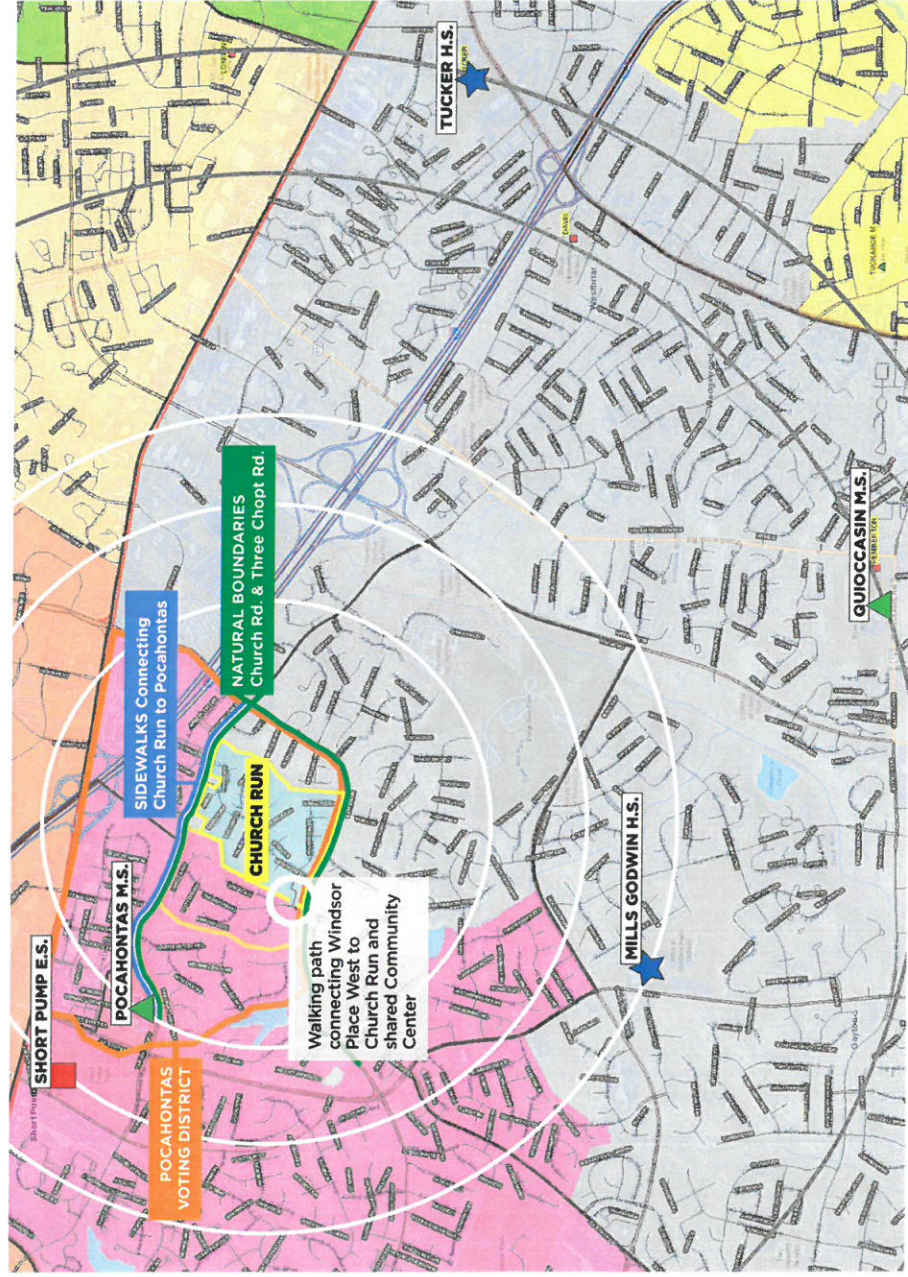

**Please cease the redistricting initiative and table it until 1) capital improvements (Elementary School in River Mill and Middle School addition in Fairfield – as well as plans for two existing High School sites) are known and completed, 2) the 2020 census numbers are available, and 3) known planned development has played out in the Glen Allen/Fairfield area.**

**In the alternative, if redistricting moves forward please consider more equitable options for the Fairfield/Glen Allen Communities, keeping these cohesive neighborhoods North of 295 in their current schools: Greenwood ES, Hungary Creek MS and Glen Allen, HS.**

### **WHY NOW? Redistricting is Premature**

- The announcement of a new elementary school and new middle school addition in the Fairfield District would seem to address immediate needs.
- After seeing how these schools impact the areas in question there is then time to reevaluate the need for redistricting.
- There are 500 homes planned in the Hermitage HS district that have not yet been developed and that will impact capacity numbers.
- A new census providing more current data is less than one year away.
- The School Board is in transition with 60% of its membership (three out of five members) new and just taking office.
- This new majority of the School Board will then have just four months to become familiar with the complex issues of rezoning before taking a vote.
- Redistricting is simply not needed at this time and will likely have to be changed again sooner than later.

**If the redistricting efforts proceed, please consider the following:**

**All current options for HCPS Redistricting 2021 will negatively affect the diverse subdivisions of the Fairfield-Glen Allen Communities.**

**We respectfully request that the Henrico County School Board reconsider these redistricting options for the following reasons:**

- I. **2021 HCPS Guideline: Major roads and natural boundaries will be used whenever feasible to define attendance zones.**
  - A. The Fairfield-Glen Allen Communities are within the boundaries of Rt. 1, I-95 and I-295.
  - B. All neighborhoods west of Rt. 1 and North of I-295 should **continue** to attend Hungary Creek Middle School and Glen Allen High school

- F. Breaking up these feeder patterns will not only violate this guideline but will stand to harm students both academically and socially.
- G. This is also why many school districts all over the country have a rule that provides for students to graduate from the same school at which they started, recognizing that it is very disruptive academically and socially for a student to switch schools, be it during elementary school, middle school or high school.
- H. Once a student enrolls in a school, that student is automatically counted in future enrollment and therefore is already accounted for when it comes to capacity.
- I. We ask that the County change its guidelines to allow students to remain in the same schools where they started, regardless of the grade level they will be in when the redistricting takes effect.

**VI. 2021 HCPS Guideline: Implementation of a redistricting plan over a span of several years would be preferable if it has the effect of minimizing the need for additional line changes for a community in the near or immediate future.**

- A. The current redistricting plan does not account for the great flurry of new development planned for the area in which Brookland Middle School is located (i.e. approximately 495 new homes built around Telegraph Rd. and Georgia Rd. that will feed the Brookland and Hermitage school district).
- B. A new plan will therefore become necessary before too long and will likely cause another disruption soon after the current rezoning proposals go into effect.
- C. It is more efficient and less costly to wait to assess the effects of the future developments in the area surrounding Brookland Middle and the Route 1 corridor.
- D. The addition to the CIP of a new elementary school in the River Mill area and an addition of a Fairfield Middle School would seem to provide the relief necessary to take some time to wait before redistricting.

**VII. Redistricting Goal: Reducing concentrations of poverty and balancing communities while improving struggling schools.**

- A. In both options, Woodman West, which is Section 8 housing, is being redistricted from Hungary Creek Middle School to Brookland Middle School which already has 73% of students who are economically disadvantaged and students in government housing in its feeder patterns.
- B. Committee members have not and will not be receiving maps showing where there are pockets of poverty and instead only received information regarding the percentage of students in each school on free/reduced lunch and who are economically disadvantaged.
- C. Committee members can only see which schools need balance but cannot determine from where to draw kids in order to achieve that balance.
- D. Greenwood Elementary School has 45.3% of students that are "Economically Disadvantaged." Those kids continue on to Hungary Creek Middle School and Glen Allen High School and therefore we believe these schools are already well balanced when it comes to poverty levels.
- E. There is an exceptional balance in the areas of linguistic, racial, economic, ethnic and religious diversity among those three schools and we want an option that honors the community that we have built within these schools.

## 8VAC20-70-160. Review of Routes.

School bus routes, school sites, and safety of pupils at designated school bus stops shall be reviewed at least once a year and as changes occur. Routes shall be reviewed for safety hazards, fuel conservation, and to assure the most efficient use of buses. Local school administrators shall evaluate the safety of pupils at bus stops periodically and shall at the request of the local school board report the results annually to the school board. Hazardous or unusual situations, to include railway crossings, shall be marked on the route sheet and made available to drivers and substitutes.

A written vehicular and pedestrian traffic control plan for each existing school site shall be reviewed annually for safety hazards. All new school site plans shall include provisions that promote vehicular and pedestrian safety.

**Petition to keep Oak Run, Morgan Run and Barony Woods Subdivisions  
in the Short Pump Elementary, Pocahontas Middle School & Godwin High School Districts  
(November 3, 2019)**

**ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:** We wanted to tell you some things you do not realize about our small community along Church Road. There are many reasons to KEEP our neighborhood (Oak Run, Morgan Run and Barony Woods subdivisions) in the Short Pump Elementary, Pocahontas Middle School & Godwin High School Districts that are HIGHLY consistent with the HCPS Policy and Regulations for Redistricting.

**1) All reasonable efforts should be made to ensure contiguous geographic zones which minimize division of clearly identifiable community components.** Our neighborhood (Oak Run, Morgan Run and Barony Woods Subdivisions) is part of a small natural contiguous community along Church Road that includes other subdivisions like Windsor Place West, Barrington, Barrington West, Church Run, Bell Tower, etc. Families and children from our small community congregate together at Church Run Pool & Recreation Center, our children swim together each summer on the community swim team, we gather for meetings and recreational activities at Pocahontas MS, our children go from subdivision to subdivision to play together, etc. Many children participate together in Spring and Fall ball on Tuckahoe Little League, etc... We have been lobbying the Henrico County Department of Public Works for continuous sidewalks and pathways along the entire length of Church Road.

**2. Efforts will be made to establish walking schools and reasonable walking zones where feasible.** We will soon have continuous sidewalks from our neighborhood all the way to Pocahontas MS that will allow our middle school students to easily and safely walk on sidewalks to Pocahontas MS. The Henrico Department of Public Works (DPW) is investing **\$25+ million** to complete the "Three Chopt Road Improvements Project" that will provide continuous sidewalks from Pocahontas MS all the way to Church Road. DPW is in the process of obtaining right-of-way and the anticipated completion date is the Summer of 2022. DPW will also be constructing a new sidewalk on Church Road from Morgan Run Road to Three Chopt Road by the Summer of 2020. The Redistricting Committee is currently recommending draft Options 3 and 5 that would move other neighborhoods that are more than four miles away into the Pocahontas MS district while our neighborhood (Morgan Run, Oak Run, and Barony Woods) which is only one mile away, is moved out! How does this make any sense?!

**3. Efforts will be made to ensure an efficient system of school bus transportation.** Our neighborhood (Morgan Run, Oak Run, and Barony Woods) is only one mile away from Pocahontas MS. How much more efficient can you get?! Sending students from our neighborhood to Quioccasin MS would send buses through the Three Chopt Road/Church Road, Gaskins Road/Three Chopt Road, Gaskins Road/Ridgefield Parkway, and Gaskins Road/Quioccasin Road intersections. Currently, our children are around 1.5 miles from Godwin HS. Our children travel on lower volume roads against rush hour traffic and the only busy intersection is Ridgefield Parkway/Pump Road at Godwin HS. Sending our children to Tucker HS will more than **double** the distance to school, and forces our children (including new young teenage drivers) across I-64 and on very busy streets and thru the very busy Church Road/Three Chopt Road, Gaskins Road/Three Chopt Road, Parham Road/Three Chopt Road intersections during and in the direction of heavy rush hour traffic in both the morning and afternoon. In draft Options for 3 and 5, the Redistricting Committee is proposing to move students out of Tucker HS who live only one mile away so that they can move our children who are 3.7 miles away into Tucker HS. How does this make any sense?!

**4. Major roads and natural boundaries will be used whenever feasible to define attendance zones.** In the recommended middle and high school draft options, we are separated from the rest of our small community along Church Road, which does not have a major road or natural boundary of separation. The obvious boundaries that should be used are Church Road (Collector Road), Three Chopt Road (Collector Road), and/or Gaskins Road (Arterial Road). The boundary should NOT be put down by our back yards or dry gulch "creek" especially when there is a major street less than 1/4<sup>th</sup> of a mile away as shown in these options. The Redistricting Committee has not considered the real boundaries of larger roads such Church Road and Three Chopt Road and is using minor landforms such back yards or a dry gulch "Creek" to try to separate us.

**5. Provisions should be made to ensure the continuity of a child's K-12 progress. This may be accomplished by offering older students in a school the option to remain at an existing school if parents provide transportation.** Children from our neighborhood should flow like other children at Short Pump ES into Pocahontas MS and Godwin HS.

**6. Implementation of a rezoning plan over a span of several years would be preferable if it has the effect of minimizing the need for additional line changes for a community in the near or immediate future.** This is perhaps our most important point: Our Neighborhoods have been redistricted at-least four times in recent years. Please take the time to plan for future communities being built in the east and north before moving our neighborhood where it will not be needed.

Our neighborhood has been recently redistricted at-least four times in recent years.









## **SAFETY IMPACTS TO CHURCH ROAD COMMUNITY (between Three Chopt Rd and John Rolfe PKWY)**

The High School and Middle School options for the Public Information Session (PIS) would create MAJOR safety impacts for the children in our Church Road community. The options now have us being moved to Quioccasin MS (QMS) and Tucker HS (THS) even though we are much closer to Pocahontas MS (PMS) and Godwin HS (GHS). The options would now require our children to travel further (twice as far) distances on much busier roads and intersections with (and in the direction of) heavy rush hour traffic. For that matter, these PIS options would place new teenage drivers at risk as they will drive to/from school for scholastic activities during school hours and after school hours and along the I-64/Broad St/Three Chopt Rd high traffic volume corridor (a 10-mile length!). At the same time, these options have other neighborhoods that are closer than our neighborhood to THS and QMS being assigned to other schools. Our community cannot comprehend why HCPS is putting the safety of our kids at risk. Safety should be HCPS' top priority and take the highest precedence over other [HCPS Policy and Regulations on Redistricting](#). I am still not clear as to how the "HCPS Project Goals" factor into this and they just confuse the situation.

### **AFFECTED CHURCH ROAD COMMUNITY SUBDIVISIONS (BETWEEN THREE CHOPT ROAD AND STONY RUN)**

- **CURRENT:**
  - GHS: Has short-run (can go on quiet streets) and short length along Ridgefield Parkway and then Pump Rd to GHS
  - PMS: Within walking distance. Has extremely short-run using (say) Church Run Parkway and then a short-length along Three Chopt Road.
- PROPOSED: THS and QMS **[MAJOR NEGATIVE TRAFFIC SAFETY IMPACTS]**
  - THS: Doubles the distance on much busier roads in direction of rush hour traffic with turns through many busy intersections: Crosses Church Road/Three Chopt Intersection (busy intersection), the very busy Three Chopt Rd/Gaskins Rd Intersection (actually busier than the N. Gayton Rd/Broad St Intersection and affected by I-64 interchange), and still many more intersections to navigate. This does not even take into the consideration the possible use of Parham Rd!!!!
  - QMS: Doubles the distance on much busier roads with turns through many busy intersections. My guess is they would run buses down Guyana Rd. (very deficient intersection with many accidents) or the busy Three Chopt Rd/Church Rd Intersection and then to the VERY busy intersection (actually busier than the N. Gayton Rd/Broad St Intersection and affected by I-64 interchange), and then still a long length with additional turns at additional busy intersections at Ridgefield Parkway/Gaskins Rd and Gayton Rd and Gaskins Rd.

### **AREAS NORTH AND SOUTH OF TUCKER HIGH SCHOOL**

- Per the various requirements in the [HCPS Policy and Regulations on Redistricting](#), all neighborhoods in close proximity to THS should be moved into THS. It makes absolutely no sense whatsoever to extend the THS district to the west. This will now extend this district over a 10-mile length along the high traffic volume (I-64 / Broad Street and Three Chopt Road Corridor). Instead, the Public Information Session Options has REDUCED the number of neighborhoods in close proximity to THS from going to THS. This makes no sense whatsoever.

### **N. GAYTON ROAD (Henrico/Goochland Border just south of Broad St ~ Greengate, Gayton Station, Foxhall, etc.)**

- CURRENT: Deep Run HS (DRHS) and Short Pump MS (SPMS)
  - DRHS: Crosses N. Gayton Rd/Broad St Intersection (very busy) and has clean short run against rush hour traffic to DRHS
  - SPMS: Crosses N. Gayton Rd/Broad St Intersection (very busy) and has short run to SPMS
- PROPOSED: GHS and PMS **[THIS DOES NOT APPEAR TO IMPROVE THE EXISTING SITUATION?]**
  - GHS: Has longer run often in same direction as rush hour with turns through many busy intersections
  - PMS: Has longer run often in same direction as rush hour with turns through many busy intersections

### **JOHN ROLFE PARKWAY-RIDGEFIELD PARKWAY-LAUDERDALE DR. (Old Coach Square, Windsor Park, Kingswood, Stonequarter, Knollingwood)**

- CURRENT & PROPOSED: GHS and PMS where GHS has a descent run to GHS & PMS has long run often in same direction as rush hour traffic with turns through many busy intersections
- **RECOMMENDED CHANGE [IMPROVES EXISTING SITUATION]**
  - QMS: Has a nice straight shot on Gayton Rd. without any turns at any intersections

### **WEST BROAD VILLAGE**

- CURRENT: DRHS and SPMS where DRHS crosses Pump Rd/Broad St. Intersection (very busy) and has clean short run against rush hour traffic to DRHS; and PMS crosses Pump Rd/Broad St Intersection (very busy) and has short run to SPMS
- PROPOSED: GHS and PMS: GHS: Has a straight shot down John Rolfe Parkway to Pump Rd to GHS / PMS: Children can walk to school

### **APARTMENTS AT THREE CHOPT ROAD AND COX ROAD (NORTHWEST QUADRANT)**

- CURRENT: DRHS and SPMS / PROPOSED: GHS and PMS
- Similar issues to our neighborhood. So, why are they swapping neighborhoods and splitting up the Church Road community and violating the [HCPS Policy and Regulations on Redistricting](#)?

**HIGHWAY SAFETY PROGRAM  
GUIDELINE No. 17  
PUPIL TRANSPORTATION SAFETY**

I. Scope. This guideline establishes minimum recommendations for a State highway safety program for pupil transportation safety including the identification, operation, and maintenance of buses used for carrying students: training of passengers, pedestrians, and bicycle riders; and administration.

II. Purpose. The purpose of this guideline is to minimize, to the greatest extent possible the danger of death or injury to school children while they are traveling to and from school and school-related events.

III. Definition.

**Bus**

A motor vehicle designed for carrying more than 10 persons (including the driver).

**Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSR)**

The regulations of the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) for commercial motor vehicles in interstate commerce, including buses with a gross vehicle weight rating (GVWR) greater than 10,000 pounds or designed to carry 16 or more persons (including the driver), other than buses used to transport school children from home to school and from school to home. (The FMCSR are set forth in 49 CFR parts 383-399.)

**School-chartered bus**

A "bus" that is operated under a short-term contract with State or school authorities who have acquired the exclusive use of the vehicle at a fixed charge to provide transportation for a group of students to a special school-related event.

**School bus**

A "bus" that is used for purposes that include carrying students to and from school or related events on a regular basis, but does not include a transit bus or a school-chartered bus.

IV. Pupil Transportation Safety Program Administration and Operations.-- Recommendation. Each State, in cooperation with its school districts and other political subdivisions, should have a comprehensive pupil transportation safety program to ensure that school buses and school-chartered buses are operated and maintained so as to achieve the highest possible level of safety.

A. Administration.

1. There should be a single State agency having primary administrative responsibility for pupil transportation, and employing at least one full-time professional to carry out these responsibilities.
2. The responsible State agency should develop an operating system for collecting and reporting information needed to improve the safety of operating school buses and school-chartered buses. This includes the collection and evaluation of uniform crash data consistent with the criteria set forth in Highway Safety Program Guidelines No. 10, "Traffic Records" and No. 18, "Accident Investigation and Reporting. "

B. Identification and equipment of school buses. Each State should establish procedures to meet the following recommendations for identification and equipment of school buses.

1. All school buses should:

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- a. Be identified with the words "School Bus" printed in letters not less than eight inches high, located between the warning signal lamps as high as possible without impairing visibility of the lettering from both front and rear, and have no other lettering on the front or rear of the vehicle, except as required by Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards (FMVSS), 49 CFR part 571.
  - b. Be painted National School Bus Glossy Yellow, in accordance with the colorimetric specification of National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) Federal Standard No. 595a, Color 13432, except that the hood should be either that color or lusterless black, matching NIST Federal Standard No. 595a, Color 37038.
  - c. Have bumpers of glossy black, matching NIST Federal Standard No. 595a, Color 17038, unless, for increased visibility, they are covered with a reflective material.
  - d. Be equipped with safety equipment for use in an emergency, including a charged fire extinguisher, that is properly mounted near the driver's seat, with signs indicating the location of such equipment.
  - e. Be equipped with device(s) demonstrated to enhance the safe operation of school vehicles, such as a stop signal arm.
  - f. Be equipped with a system of signal lamps that conforms to the school bus requirements of FMVSS No. 108, 49 CFR 571.108.
  - g. Have a system of mirrors that conforms to the school bus requirements of FMVSS No. 111, 49 CFR 571.111.
  - h. Comply with all FMVSS applicable to school buses at the time of their manufacture.
2. Any school bus meeting the identification recommendations of sections 1, a-h above that is permanently converted for use wholly for purposes other than transporting children to and from school or school-related events should be painted a color other than National School Bus Glossy Yellow, and should have the stop arms and school bus signal lamps described by sections 1, e & f removed.
  3. School buses, while being operated on a public highway and transporting primarily passengers other than school children, should have the words "School Bus" covered, removed, or otherwise concealed, and the stop arm and signal lamps described by sections 1, e & f should not be operated.
  4. School-chartered buses should comply with all applicable FMCSR and FMVSS.
- C. Operations. Each State should establish procedures to meet the following recommendations for operating school buses and school-chartered buses:
1. Personnel.
    - a. Each State should develop a plan for selecting, training, and supervising persons whose primary duties involve transporting school children in order to ensure that such persons will attain a high degree of competence in, and knowledge of, their duties.
    - b. Every person who drives a school bus or school-chartered bus occupied by school children should, as a minimum:
      1. Have a valid State driver's license to operate such a vehicle. All drivers who operate a vehicle designed to carry 16 or more persons (including the driver) are



required by FHWA's Commercial Driver's License Standards by April 1, 1992 (49 CFR part 383) to have a valid commercial driver's license;

2. Meet all physical, mental, moral and other requirements established by the State agency having primary responsibility for pupil transportation, including requirements for drug and/or alcohol misuse or abuse; and
3. Be qualified as a driver under the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations of the FHWA, 49 CFR part 391, if the driver or the driver's employer is subject to those regulations.

## 2. Vehicles.

- a. Each State should enact legislation that provides for uniform procedures regarding school buses stopping on public highways for loading and discharge of children. Public information campaigns should be conducted on a regular basis to ensure that the driving public fully understands the implications of school bus warning signals and requirements to stop for school buses that are loading or discharging school children.

- b. Each State should develop plans for minimizing highway use hazards to school bus and school-chartered bus occupants, other highway users, pedestrians, bicycle riders and property. They should include, but not be limited to:

1. Careful planning and annual review of routes for safety hazards;
  2. Planning routes to ensure maximum use of school buses and school chartered buses, and to ensure that passengers are not standing while these vehicles are in operation;
  3. Providing loading and unloading zones off the main traveled part, of highways, whenever it is practical to do so;
  4. Establishing restricted loading and unloading areas for school buses and school-chartered buses at or near schools;
  5. Ensuring that school bus operators, when stopping on a highway to take on or discharge children, adhere to State regulations for loading and discharging including the use of signal lamps as specified in section B.1.f. of this guideline;
  6. Prohibiting, by legislation or regulation, operation of any school bus unless it meets the equipment and identification recommendations of this guideline; and
  7. Replacing, consistent with the economic realities which typically face school districts, those school buses which are not manufactured to meet the April 1, 1977 FMVSS for school buses, with those manufactured to meet the stricter school bus standards, and not chartering any pre-1977 school buses.
  8. Informing potential buyers of pre 1977 school buses that these buses may not meet current standards for newly manufactured buses and of the need for continued maintenance of these buses and adequate safety instruction.
- c. Use of amber signal lamps to indicate that a school bus is preparing to stop to load or unload children is at the option of the State. Use of red warning signal lamps as specified in section B, 1, f, of this guideline for any purpose or at any time other than when the school bus is stopped to load or discharge passengers should be prohibited.

- d. When school buses are equipped with stop arms, such devices should be operated only in conjunction with red warning signal lamps, when vehicles are stopped.
- e. Seating.
  - 1. Standing while school buses and school-chartered buses are in motion should not be permitted. Routing and seating plans should be coordinated so as to eliminate passengers standing when a school bus or school chartered bus is in motion.
  - 2. Seating should be provided that will permit each occupant to sit in a seat intended by the vehicle's manufacturer to provide accommodation for a person at least as large as a 5th percentile adult female, as defined in 49 CFR 571.208. Due to the variation in sizes of children of different ages, States and school districts should exercise judgment in deciding how many students are actually transported in a school bus or school -chartered bus.
  - 3. There should be no auxiliary seating accommodations such as temporary or folding jump seats in school buses.
  - 4. Drivers of school buses and school-chartered buses should be required to wear occupant restraints whenever the vehicle is in motion.
  - 5. Passengers in school buses and school-chartered buses with a gross vehicle weight rating (GVWR) of 10,000 pounds or less should be required to wear occupant restraints (where provided) whenever the vehicle is in motion. Occupant restraints should comply with the requirements of FMVSS Nos. 208, 209 and 210, as they apply to multipurpose vehicles.
- f. Emergency exit access. Baggage and other items transported in the passenger compartment should be stored and secured so that the aisles are kept clear and the door(s) and emergency exit(s) remain unobstructed at all times. When school buses are equipped with interior luggage racks, the racks should be capable of retaining their contents in a crash or sudden driving maneuver.

D. Vehicle maintenance. Each State should establish procedures to meet the following recommendations for maintaining buses used to carry school children:

- 1. School buses should be maintained in safe operating condition through a systematic preventive maintenance program.
- 2. All school buses should be inspected at least semiannually. In addition, school buses and school-chartered buses subject to the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations of FHWA should be inspected and maintained in accordance with those regulations (49 CFR Parts 393 and 396).
- 3. School bus drivers should be required to perform daily pre-trip inspections of their vehicles, and the safety equipment thereon (especially fire extinguishers), and to report promptly and in writing any problems discovered that may affect the safety of the vehicle's operation or result in its mechanical breakdown. Pre-trip inspection and condition reports for school buses and school-chartered buses subject to the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations of FHWA should be performed in accordance with those regulations (49 CFR 392.7, 392.8, and 396).

E. Other Aspects of Pupil Transportation Safety.

1. At least once during each school semester, each pupil transported from home to school in a school bus should be instructed in safe riding practices, proper loading and unloading techniques, proper street crossing to and from school bus stops and should participate in supervised emergency evacuation drills, which are timed. Prior to each departure, each pupil transported on an activity or field trip in a school bus or school -chartered bus should be instructed in safe riding practices and on the location and operation of emergency exits.
2. Parents and school officials should work together to select and designate the safest pedestrian and bicycle routes for the use of school children.
3. All school children should be instructed in safe transportation practices for walking to and from school. For those children who routinely walk to school, training should include preselected routes and the importance of adhering to those routes.
4. Children riding bicycles to and from school should receive bicycle safety education, wear bicycle safety helmets, and not deviate from preselected routes.
5. Local school officials and law enforcement personnel should work together to establish crossing guard programs.
6. Local school officials should investigate programs which incorporate the practice of escorting students across streets and highways when they leave school buses. These programs may include the use of school safety patrols or adult monitors.
7. Local school officials should establish passenger vehicle loading and unloading points at schools that are separate from the school bus loading zones.

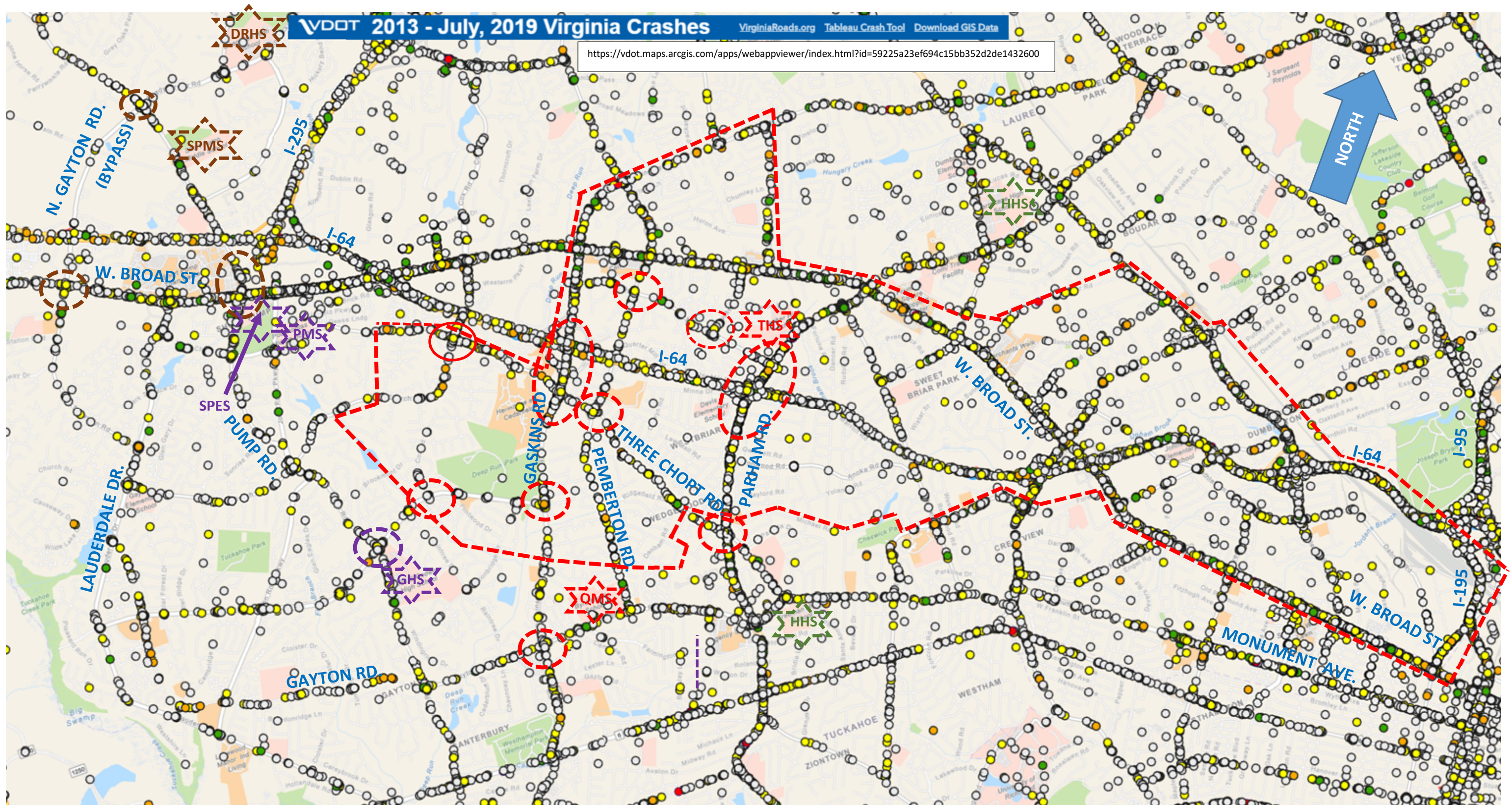
V. Program evaluation. The pupil transportation safety program should be evaluated at least annually by the State agency having primary administrative responsibility for pupil transportation.

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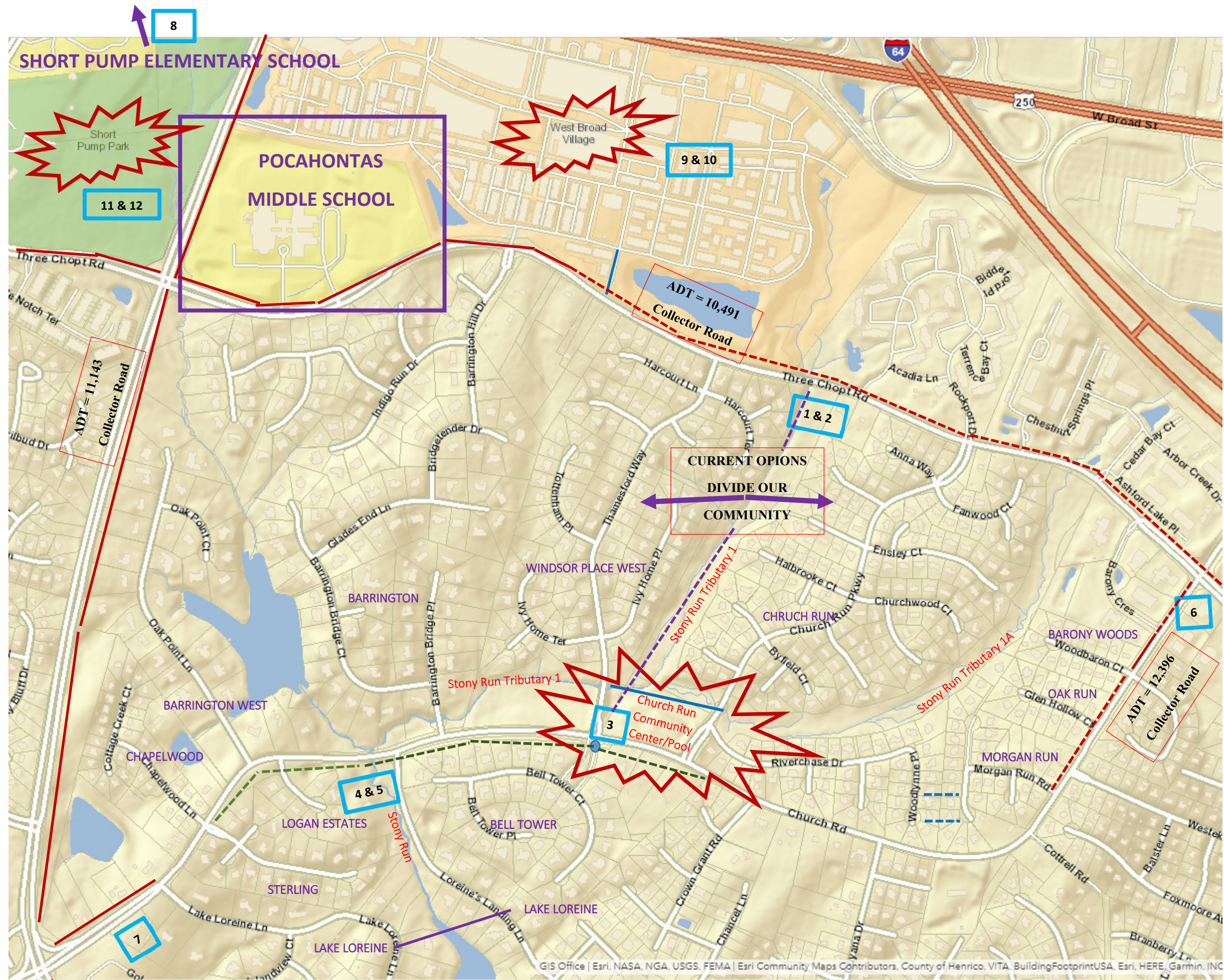

**HIGHWAY SAFETY PROGRAM  
GUIDELINE No. 17  
PUPIL TRANSPORTATION SAFETY**

- I. Scope. This guideline establishes minimum recommendations for a State highway safety program for pupil transportation safety including the identification, operation, and maintenance of buses used for carrying students: training of passengers, pedestrians, and bicycle riders; and administration.
- II. Purpose. The purpose of this guideline is to minimize, to the greatest extent possible the danger of death or injury to school children while they are traveling to and from school and school-related events.
- III. Definition.

**Bus**

A motor vehicle designed for carrying more than 10 persons (including the driver).

**Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSR)**

The regulations of the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) for commercial motor vehicles in interstate commerce, including buses with a gross vehicle weight rating (GVWR) greater than 10,000 pounds or designed to carry 16 or more persons (including the driver), other than buses used to transport school children from home to school and from school to home. (The FMCSR are set forth in 49 CFR parts 383-399.)

**School-chartered bus**

A "bus" that is operated under a short-term contract with State or school authorities who have acquired the exclusive use of the vehicle at a fixed charge to provide transportation for a group of students to a special school-related event.

**School bus**

A "bus" that is used for purposes that include carrying students to and from school or related events on a regular basis, but does not include a transit bus or a school-chartered bus.

- IV. Pupil Transportation Safety Program Administration and Operations.-- Recommendation. Each State, in cooperation with its school districts and other political subdivisions, should have a comprehensive pupil transportation safety program to ensure that school buses and school-chartered buses are operated and maintained so as to achieve the highest possible level of safety.

**A. Administration.**

1. There should be a single State agency having primary administrative responsibility for pupil transportation, and employing at least one full-time professional to carry out these responsibilities.
2. The responsible State agency should develop an operating system for collecting and reporting information needed to improve the safety of operating school buses and school-chartered buses. This includes the collection and evaluation of uniform crash data consistent with the criteria set forth in Highway Safety Program Guidelines No. 10, "Traffic Records" and No. 18, "Accident Investigation and Reporting. "

- B. Identification and equipment of school buses.** Each State should establish procedures to meet the following recommendations for identification and equipment of school buses.

1. All school buses should:

- a. Be identified with the words "School Bus" printed in letters not less than eight inches high, located between the warning signal lamps as high as possible without impairing visibility of the lettering from both front and rear, and have no other lettering on the front or rear of the vehicle, except as required by Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards (FMVSS), 49 CFR part 571.
  - b. Be painted National School Bus Glossy Yellow, in accordance with the colorimetric specification of National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) Federal Standard No. 595a, Color 13432, except that the hood should be either that color or lusterless black, matching NIST Federal Standard No. 595a, Color 37038.
  - c. Have bumpers of glossy black, matching NIST Federal Standard No. 595a, Color 17038, unless, for increased visibility, they are covered with a reflective material.
  - d. Be equipped with safety equipment for use in an emergency, including a charged fire extinguisher, that is properly mounted near the driver's seat, with signs indicating the location of such equipment.
  - e. Be equipped with device(s) demonstrated to enhance the safe operation of school vehicles, such as a stop signal arm.
  - f. Be equipped with a system of signal lamps that conforms to the school bus requirements of FMVSS No. 108, 49 CFR 571.108.
  - g. Have a system of mirrors that conforms to the school bus requirements of FMVSS No. 111, 49 CFR 571.111.
  - h. Comply with all FMVSS applicable to school buses at the time of their manufacture.
2. Any school bus meeting the identification recommendations of sections 1, a-h above that is permanently converted for use wholly for purposes other than transporting children to and from school or school-related events should be painted a color other than National School Bus Glossy Yellow, and should have the stop arms and school bus signal lamps described by sections 1, e & f removed.
  3. School buses, while being operated on a public highway and transporting primarily passengers other than school children, should have the words "School Bus" covered, removed, or otherwise concealed, and the stop arm and signal lamps described by sections 1, e & f should not be operated.
  4. School-chartered buses should comply with all applicable FMCSR and FMVSS.
- C. Operations. Each State should establish procedures to meet the following recommendations for operating school buses and school-chartered buses:
1. Personnel.
    - a. Each State should develop a plan for selecting, training, and supervising persons whose primary duties involve transporting school children in order to ensure that such persons will attain a high degree of competence in, and knowledge of, their duties.

Further to our discussion today. Some background. I reached out to the Department of Education with regards to any redistricting requirements. They came back with reviewing school bus routes during a school division redistricting scenario. Please see the email thread below.

We have had Citizen Redistricting Committee (CRC) Members tell us that HCPS Transportation staff indicated that there is a 'hard boundary' at Broad Street for Pump Road and N. Gayton Road. CRC Members indicated to myself and neighbors that due to the above statements they selected options that push current Deep Run HS and Short Pump MS students (areas south of Broad Street) into Godwin HS and Pocahontas MS. Meanwhile, these options then push our children much further away into Tucker HS and Quioccasin MS. Our children would now have to travel longer distances, on busier roads, in the direction of rush hour traffic, through the higher volume Gaskins Road/Three Chopt Road Intersection (that is effectively tied into the ramps for the I-64/Gaskins Rd Interchange), AND more accidents. Bottom line, we are highly concerned with regards to safety of our children.

During the discussion this evening, your HCPS Transportation staff advised that they suggested during the CRC meetings as to a boundary along West Broad Street due to bus "efficiency". Based on my 30-years of experience in the field of transportation engineering, I would disagree with the efficiency of the new routes and think the routes also appear to be less safe. You can see some of my discussion on page Page 8 of the attachment. Using Pages 15 and 16, I completed a review of likely routes, distances from student catchment areas to schools, average daily traffic volumes, direction of rush hour traffic on routes, accident clusters, intersections, and interchanges. To me, the potential bus routes seem less efficient and less safe for the affected areas of Deep Run HS, Short Pump MS, Godwin HS, Pocahontas MS, Tucker HS and Quioccasin MS. I would be more than happy to sit down with your staff and more thoroughly review and discuss.

My profession has been making huge advancements in data science, GIS, multi-objective analysis, linear reference systems for roadways, automatic routing systems, etc. I know we could easily use traffic data on GIS layers and use purely objective methods with appropriate criteria that would quantitatively show the relative safety of bus route options.

Mr. Springer,

From the state level, Virginia doesn't have any specific transportation code concerning public school division redistricting. Below is the public school transportation code concerning school bus routes that normally would be affected in a school division redistricting scenario. I've also included the link to Chapter 70. Regulations Governing Pupil Transportation for your reference.

#### **8VAC20-70-160. Review of Routes.**

School bus routes, school sites, and safety of pupils at designated school bus stops shall be reviewed at least once a year and as changes occur. Routes shall be reviewed for safety hazards, fuel conservation, and to assure the most efficient use of buses. Local school administrators shall evaluate the safety of pupils at bus stops periodically and shall at the request of the local school board report the results annually to the school board. Hazardous or unusual situations, to include railway crossings, shall be marked on the route sheet and made available to drivers and substitutes.

A written vehicular and pedestrian traffic control plan for each existing school site shall be reviewed annually for safety hazards. All new school site plans shall include provisions that promote vehicular and pedestrian safety.
