Bowen 1201 Peachtree Blvd. Richmond, Virginia 23226 (804) 285-5805</p> <p>~Monumental Floral Gardens~</p> <p>October 11, 2019</p> <p>My husband and I are in support of Redistricting Options as follows (as of options available 10/10/19): High School Option 2</p> <p>Redistricting Questions and Concerns:</p> <p>I am a Licensed Landscape Architect in the state of Virginia and a Senior Planner for Hanover County. While I applaud the time, care and effort that the committee has graciously given this task, I feel that this process is being rushed, and there are profound implications being ignored. I have not been encouraged by the results of the preliminary re-districting options. At none of the meetings that I have attended, nor in any of the literature that I have received or read online have I been introduced to or seen evidence from a Planning professional studied and versed in areas of community development, community growth and success, or demographic inclusion and balance. It is very clear, by the result of the preliminary mapping options presented in October, that there is no cohesive representation of the true communities and their natural boundaries or the neighborhoods that make up these communities.</p> <p>I am perplexed as to why the County would take on such an enormous and all encompassing task without including this type of professional analysis and without undertaking the due diligence required to accomplish such a feat. This entire process should have begun with these professionals hitting the pavement and performing field studies and research to prepare maps that show the existing natural communities, their established boundaries and the populace and socio-economic demographics within each. I have not seen any evidence of such work.</p> <p>I have no reason to believe that Cropper GIS is anything less than a very fine mapping company, but I do believe that the County owes its residents a much more comprehensive study that is sensitive to the needs of the individual communities and their relationships with each other. I also feel very strongly that, before the County makes any decisions on this re-districting, the responsible parties need to ask what has been done to incorporate the needs within boundaries of the existing and established communities. There should not be any decisions made based on the maps provided thus far, because they are not based on our individual communities, the needs of the communities or how they function internally and externally.</p> <p>Please see concerns, as follows:</p> <p>1. Broad Street up to the I-64 interchange and then along I-64 W to Parham Road is our community’s northern boundary. • It is a very intense commercial area that, as a community, we utilize its commercial commodities such as shopping, restaurants and professional services. • We take advantage of its extensive interstate accesses, use it to traverse the far reaches of the county when needed, but we respect it as the strongly established boundary that it is. • Broad Street and I-64 have an extremely high traffic impact that is not conducive to bridging communities across it.</p> <p>2. Monument Avenue is a very important interior arterial road at the heart of our community. • Our living community and neighborhoods surround this interior arterial.</p>

By doing this, the County would be enabling hardships on our commercial community.</p> <p>4. Re: County Redistricting Goal â€œReducing concentrations of poverty while balancing a community or neighborhood school conceptâ€œ</p> <p>â€œ I want to see the research data on the demographics and the communities they serve - NOT just the population numbers.</p> <p>â€œ We can throw those numbers at the plan a hundred different ways and achieve similar population balance.</p> <p>â€œ I want to see the community data and mapping data that pinpoints local places of interest and gathering, such as shopping districts and service districts, community and municipal buildings.</p> <p>i. Additionally, I want to see mapping and research for where our schools lie within these districts and how these districts relate to each other, and what neighborhoods patronize them.</p> <p>â€œ What happened to the balance for which you promised to strive? Have you researched the socioeconomic results of Options **1, 3 and 4?</p> <p>i. These options bus lower income neighborhoods to farther reaching schools, leaving the more affluent neighborhoods untouched.</p> <p>ii. Why are the lower income neighborhoods solely being targeted to move?</p> <p>â€œ I donâ€™t see how they can attempt to undertake such a huge, all-encompassing redistricting task without that information, and, if they donâ€™t have it, I want to know why not. This is not just a numbers game. Those numbers should be aligned to fit our community needs.</p> <p>â€œ Plus, if you break up communities â€œ not just ours, several others are in the same boat in Options **1, 3 and 4 â€œ the numbers data is no longer valid.</p> <p>5. The County has indicated that you want to disrupt as little as possible with these changes. Options **1, 3 and 4 are moving dozens of square miles of homes out of the school districts they are currently planned to attend.</p> <p>â€œ Our subdivision has been attending Tuckahoe Middle School and Freeman High School for decades. I have spoken with neighbors who have grown children with kids of their own who went to Freeman High School from our neighborhood.</p> <p>â€œ Our relationship with our community is a direct result of the relationship we have had with our schools.</p> <p>â€œ Our traffic patterns, commercial districts, service districts, residential districts and social districts are all connected and have grown together as a direct result of how our community serves our needs in matters such as schools, daycare, worship, shopping, extra curricular activities for children and many others.</p> <p>â€œ The programs and curriculums at the schools that we are currently attending have been molded to meet the needs and desires of the neighborhoods they serve. It would be a disservice to these kids to force them into programs that are designed for other demographics.</p> <p>6. Our students currently in the Tuckahoe/Freeman pattern have just undergone a major disruption in their schooling because of the construction ongoing their entire middle school years.</p> <p>â€œ This disruption caused school-wide and individual anxiety, also mistrust and aggravation within our students attending during these years.</p> <p>â€œ Administration and teacher faculty changes and limitations in facility resources put our kids at a disadvantage scholastically and extra-curricularly.</p> <p>â€œ After experiencing so much strife at the hands of the County, it is unconscionable for you to cause additional disruption and anxiety during these kidsâ€™ critical high school years.</p> <p>â€œ Colleges, especially the great colleges found in Virginia, pay attention to middle and high school grades, study habits and extra-curricular patterns.</p> <p>i. The application process is harder now than ever before, and it is only going to get more selective in the coming years.</p> <p>ii. Because of the enormous amount of college applications that institutions receive, any disruption in schooling - regardless of the instigation - could put our childrenâ€™s applications at a disadvantage.</p> <p>7. While I realize that Henrico County strives to incorporate equal curriculum opportunities across all of its schools, it is a fact that programs and curriculums have been molded to meet the needs and desires of the neighborhoods they serve.</p> <p>â€œ Families research schools and their educational opportunities before buying homes. On the other hand, we are being moved out of Pinchbeck (Wynmoor/Sussex subdivisions), a school we really like, with no clear rationale. The school is only slightly over capacity (2%) and our children cannot walk to the school to which we are being rezoned (they would need to walk/ride along a busy road without sidewalks and cross Gayton, a major street). The demographics of Pinchbeck and the potential rezoned school are quite similar, further complicating Goal #4. While I appreciate the complexity of the challenge and the work done to date, I must emphatically state that OPTION 2 is the overwhelming choice for redistricting. I am deeply concerned that the other options ignore neighborhood and civic communities structures that are in place on our community. Children of all ages will be unnecessarily transported across natural traffic boundaries, particularly Broad Street and at the high school level, interstate 64 adding unnecessary travel time and expense. Option 2 maximizes the utilization of the Holliday ES school expansion while also increasing the overall enrollment to the Tucker High School. Option 2 address the projected growth and crowding in the Glen Allen HS school district and significantly increases the utilization of the Hermitage HS complex. Option 2 preserves the Crestview School relationship with the Tuckahoe Middle/Freeman relationship. Church Run and Windsor Place share a community pool and tennis courts located at the bottom of Church Run with a concrete sidewalk connecting Windsor Place. These neighborhoods are essentially across the street from Pocahontas MS. In the 2008/2009 redistricting, Church Run, Windsor Place and Barrington were collectively redistricted from Deep Run HS to Godwin High School. We have lived here for 3 years and we have a number of thoughts we would like to share with you.</p> <p>I strongly oppose High School Option 1 that rezones Crestview from Freeman to Tucker for the following reasons:</p> <p>Procedural Guidelines and Highway Split: The county promised to look closely at whether or not a highway splits through a school zone. This clearly did not occur with the Tucker rezoning draft option 1. A neighborhood directly north of Tucker High School was removed from the Tucker zone (Longan Elementary zone, which is only 1.3 miles away from Tucker High) and rezoned to a high school close to 5 miles away from them (Glen Allen) simply to allow the Tucker zone to have space for the Crestview Elementary zone. It’s very hard to understand how this helps any parents and students feel that they are part of this process as a human being instead of just a number. According to the procedural guidelines as listed on the Henrico County Public Schools website, “Major roads and natural boundaries will be used whenever feasible to define attendance zones”. I64 and Broad street are major roads which we would have to use or cross in order to get to Tucker (or else drive right by Freeman). The guidelines also state, “Efforts will be made to establish walking schools and reasonable walking zones where feasible”- no one will be able to safely walk or bike to Tucker from our neighborhoods. Meanwhile, there are already a number of students who bike to Freeman from our neighborhood now.</p> <p>Diversity: Our corridor and neighborhood is a diversity feeder to both Tuckahoe Middle and Freeman High, which strongly and positively benefits both schools and our community. Our neighborhood and immediate surrounding area is very socioeconomically diverse. Crestview families live in houses, apartments ranging in rental prices from under \$800 to well over \$2000, and a number of families live in homes with extended family members. Crestview serves a large amount of free/reduced lunches (over 50%). Each year, Crestview Elementary holds and International Dinner, and guests attend from all over the county to be a part of this very special event/occasion. According to the National Center for Educational Statistics, close to 50% of Crestview students identify as non-white students. If Crestview stopped feeding into Freeman and started feeding into Tucker it would have a major effect on the diversity breakdown at those schools. Freeman High is a great opportunity for our Crestview students who may not have an option to attend a specialty center or another high performing school with a longstanding positive reputation like Freeman High. Removing this option and opportunity does the opposite of leveling the playing field for our students who may not have the same benefits the affluent students of Henrico County Public Schools already have.</p> <p>Safety: The route to Tucker versus Freeman from the Crestview zone is not at all ideal. To get to Tucker, one must either cross or use major and very busy roads/interstates (Broad Street or I64), or drive down Three Chopt, which means students would drive past Freeman to get to Tucker. Traffic patterns down these roads that are already busy with commuters will be negatively affected, and the county will bear the responsibility of forcing inexperienced drivers (juniors and seniors who drive themselves to school) to commute to school on an interstate or major, busy commuter roads.</p> <p>Community: Our community is bordered on the North by Broad Street- a major commuter road. Crestview family community and social interactions take place south of Broad- shopping, Tuckahoe YMCA, sports teams and activities, churches, swim clubs, etc. – all of this occurs in the Three Chopt to River Road corridor. Crestview Students are already making lifelong friendships with Tuckahoe Middle School and Freeman High School students. Furthermore, Henrico County has invested \$25 million for improvements including walking path along Three Chopt that should be completed by 2022, according to their website. https://henrico.us/projects/three-chopt-road-improvement/ We are less than 1 mile from PMS and share the same road, Three Chopt. This is a major argument for having an efficient school bus transportation system. To have our children be bused to QMS, they would have to go through at least 4 major intersections. That is a safety issue for my family. Same concern for Tucker HS, which is 4 miles away from our neighborhood, and Godwin is only 2. Thank you so much for hearing my concerns.

Crestview is already a small school and I am very concerned about the transition of these children from middle to high school. They will have very few familiar faces if any in their classes. To most children this is not a big deal, however, for children with mental disorders such as anxiety, depression and other mental illnesses this could make them feel isolated. My daughter suffers from Bipolar II disorder and anxiety. For her, a new situation where she does not know someone is a big trigger. Anxiety and depression is a growing problem with middle and high school students. Transitioning to high school is stressful enough for teens but to add in a new school with almost all new students could make or break their high school experience. Bowen 1201 Peachtree Blvd. Richmond, Virginia 23226 (804) 285-5805</p> <p>~Monumental Floral Gardens~</p> <p>October 11, 2019</p> <p>I am in support of Redistricting Options as follows (as of options available 10/10/19): High School Option 2</p> <p>Redistricting Questions and Concerns:</p> <p>While I applaud the time, care and effort that the committee has graciously given this task, I feel that this process is being rushed, and there are profound implications being ignored. I have not been encouraged by the results of the preliminary re-districting options. At none of the meetings that I have attended, nor in any of the literature that I have received or read online have I been introduced to or seen evidence from a Planning professional studied and versed in areas of community development, community growth and success, or demographic inclusion and balance. It is very clear, by the result of the preliminary mapping options presented in October, that there is no cohesive representation of the true communities and their natural boundaries or the neighborhoods that make up these communities.</p> <p>I am perplexed as to why the County would take on such an enormous and all encompassing task without including this type of professional analysis and without undertaking the due diligence required to accomplish such a feat. This entire process should have begun with these professionals hitting the pavement and performing field studies and research to prepare maps that show the existing natural communities, their established boundaries and the populace and socio-economic demographics within each. I have not seen any evidence of such work.</p> <p>I have no reason to believe that Cropper GIS is anything less than a very fine mapping company, but I do believe that the County owes its residents a much more comprehensive study that is sensitive to the needs of the individual communities and their relationships with each other. I also feel very strongly that, before the County makes any decisions on this re-districting, the responsible parties need to ask what has been done to incorporate the needs within the boundaries of the existing and established communities. There should not be any decisions made based on the maps provided thus far, because they are not based on our individual communities, the needs of the communities or how they function internally and externally.</p> <p>Please see concerns, as follows:</p> <p>Broad Street up to the I-64 interchange and then along I-64 W to Parham Road is our communityâ€™s northern boundary. It is a very intense commercial area that, as a community, we utilize its commercial commodities such as shopping, restaurants and professional services. We take advantage of its extensive interstate accesses, use it to traverse the far reaches of the county when needed, but we respect it as the strongly established boundary that it is. Broad Street and I-64 have an extremely high traffic impact that is not conducive to bridging communities across it.</p> <p>Monument Avenue is a very important interior arterial road at the heart of our community. Our living community and neighborhoods surround this interior arterial. It provides access to the basic circulation patterns of our everyday needs, such as schools, grocery stores, places of worship, daycares, shopping centers and small locally owned businesses that we as a community want to support and are proud to do so. It provides simple access to other important interior arterial roads within our community such as Three Chopt Road and Patterson Ave.</p>

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			<p>It is not a boundary road, and it should not be forced into being one. Nor should it be broken from its sister interior arterial roads. These roads make up the heartbeat of our community.</p> <p>The basic and number one rule for Community Development is to support the community with our patronage. Our community encourages such patronage by attending our local public schools. We will be more likely to utilize our local community businesses and service industry if it is convenient to the daily life cycles and circulation patterns of our children, as they are the centers of our families. By bussing our children out of our community, it would be doing a disservice to the local businesses in which the County has worked hard to encourage viability. Willow Lawn Shopping Center has had much more success lately as it has made some major changes in the last ten years, and it would be doing them a great disservice to encourage community dwellers to shop elsewhere by discouraging the convenience that it now offers by forcing its community members to break community patterns. By doing this, the County would be enabling hardships on our commercial community.</p> <p>Re: County Redistricting Goal “Reducing concentrations of poverty while balancing a community or neighborhood school concept” I want to see the research data on the demographics and the communities they serve - NOT just the population numbers. We can throw those numbers at the plan a hundred different ways and achieve similar population balance. I want to see the community data and mapping data that pinpoints local places of interest and gathering, such as shopping districts and service districts, community and municipal buildings. Additionally, I want to see mapping and research for where our schools lie within these districts and how these districts relate to each other, and what neighborhoods patronize them. What happened to the balance for which you promised to strive? Have you researched the socioeconomic results of Options 1, 3 and 4? These options bus lower income neighborhoods to farther reaching schools, leaving the more affluent neighborhoods untouched. Why are the lower income neighborhoods solely being targeted to move? I don’t see how they can attempt to undertake such a huge, all-encompassing redistricting task without that information, and, if they don’t have it, I want to know why not. This is not just a numbers game. Those numbers should be aligned to fit our community needs. Plus, if you break up communities “not just ours, several others are in the same boat in Options 1, 3 and 4” the numbers data is no longer valid.</p> <p>The County has indicated that you want to disrupt as little as possible with these changes. Options 1, 3 and 4 are moving dozens of square miles of homes out of the school districts they are currently planned to attend. Our subdivision has been attending Tuckahoe Middle School and Freeman High School for decades. I have spoken with neighbors who have grown children with kids of their own who went to Freeman High School from our neighborhood. Our relationship with our community is a direct result of the relationship we have had with our schools. Our traffic patterns, commercial districts, service districts, residential districts and social districts are all connected and have grown together as a direct result of how our community serves our needs in matters such as schools, daycare, worship, shopping, extra curricular activities for children and many others. The programs and curriculums at the schools that we are currently attending have been molded to meet the needs and desires of the neighborhoods they serve. It would be a disservice to these kids to force them into programs that are designed for other demographics.</p> <p>Our students currently in the Tuckahoe/Freeman pattern has just undergone a major disruption in their schooling because of the construction ongoing their entire middle school years. This disruption caused school-wide and individual anxiety, also mistrust and aggravation within our students attending during these years. Administration and teacher faculty changes and limitations in facility resources put our kids at a disadvantage scholastically and extra-curricularly. After experiencing so much strife at the hands of the County, it is unconscionable for you to cause additional disruption and anxiety during these kids’ critical high school years. Colleges, especially the great colleges found in Virginia, pay attention to middle and high school grades, study habits and extra-curricular patterns. The application process is harder now than ever before, and it is only going to get more selective in the coming years. Because of the enormous amount of college applications that institutions receive, any disruption in schooling - regardless of the instigation - could put our children’s applications at a disadvantage.</p> <p>While I realize that Henrico County strives to incorporate equal curriculum opportunities across all of its schools, it is a fact that programs and curriculums have been molded to meet the needs and desires of the neighborhoods they serve. Families research schools and their educational opportunities before buying homes. These families count on the programs, curriculums and advanced studies being provided in their chosen school district. As kids begin to plan for their futures after graduation, they depend on the curriculums provided in their expected upper level schools. Where is the plan by the County to equate these curriculums into the schools they plan to bus these kids to? Why is the County forcing kids to make curriculum changes before they (the County) has a plan in place for compensating for the lack of desired curriculums in other schools? The desire to be a part of school districts that meet the growing family’s needs and expectation creates a high demand for the residential properties in those districts. Families buy the biggest purchase of their lives “their homes” based on the school districts the homes are within, sometimes solely.</p> <p>The high demand for our neighborhoods increases the value of these properties. It is my understanding that the County would like to disregard these impacts in the redistricting analysis, however this would be considered irresponsible on the part of the persons who make these decisions, especially considering the very unstable economic climate we have right now. If the school district of a given neighborhood and community changes to something other than what was valued as more desirable, the value of these residential properties is in jeopardy. Mortgages, second mortgages, home equity lines and credit lines have been based on the values as the school districts are arranged now. For the County to do something that would change the value of these properties would impose a fiscal and financial hardship on the homeowners in the affected areas.</p>

Has anyone consulted VDOT about the traffic impact of having all of the busses travel so much farther, and adding so much more volume to the already congested traffic traversing along and across Broad Street, along Parham Road and on and off I-64?</p> <p>I realize that Henrico County maintains their own roads, so did they consult their traffic engineers about the impacts that their preliminary proposals may have?</p> <p>There are several major interchanges entering and exiting I-64 that would have to be navigated by the school busses during intense hours of traffic if our children were to have to attend Brookland Middle School, Moody Middle School or Tucker High School.</p> <p>This would be unnecessarily putting our children in additional danger every day, and even more so when they start to drive themselves in high school!</p> <p>The most convenient and safe route for our neighborhood to drive out of our community and get to Tucker High School is to travel Three Chopt Road directly past the currently designated high school, Douglas S. 2019/10/16 1:41:20 PM PDT	Crestview ES / Freeman HS	Monumental Floral Gardens	<p>I am concerned about the proposals to redistrict my neighborhood (Monumental Floral Gardens) away from the current feeder pattern of Crestview ES > Tuckahoe MS > Freeman HS. I oppose ES Option 4 and support only HS Option 2.</p> <p>First, I am concerned with ES Option 4 to move my neighborhood from Crestview ES to Johnson ES. Such an option violates guidelines identified by the HCPS in this process in obvious ways. It ignores use of “major roads and natural boundaries” in setting the attendance zone for Johnson ES; Broad St. is very clearly a major road (per VDOT it is classified as an Urban Principal Arterial and is a six-lane roadway divided by a raised median with speed limits of 45 mph). Remaining at Crestview would not require crossing Broad St. during morning and afternoon rush hours, whereas navigating to Johnson from our neighborhood would require doing so; this would add an unnecessary amount of additional time, stress, and risk to our families, daily. Relatedly, this violates guidelines on making zones walkable (or bike-able) and ensuring an efficient bus transportation system. The need to cross Broad St. would make a safe walk or bike to school for our family impossible and dealing with the additional red lights and traffic will add significant time and potential for delays to any bus routes attempting to take children from our neighborhood to Johnson ES; remaining at Crestview would meet these previously stated guidelines.</p> <p>Additionally, ES Option 4 very clearly violates the guideline that “all reasonable efforts should be made to ensure contiguous geographic zones which minimize division of clearly identifiable community components.” By any definition, Option 4 splits our community in unreasonable ways. In walking around the neighborhood, there is no clear delineation between the areas zoned for Crestview and Johnson in Option 4. Further, that option makes several bewildering, unreasonable divisions, including zoning homes on each side of the same street to different schools (W. Club Lane and Monument Ave.) and leaving a strip of homes on the south side of Monument Ave in the Crestview zone for no apparent reason.</p> <p>Also, it seems unnecessary to disrupt children’s education and social development by splitting them from their ES cohort when sending them to MS. Option 4 is the only one that would result in our children attending a different MS than the majority of their classmates. Lastly, none of the statistics released by HCPS show current or future overcrowding at Crestview. Therefore, there does not appear to be a pressing need to remove our neighborhood from the Crestview zone. In fact, doing so under Option 4 would result in the least efficient use of space at Crestview without materially altering the utilization at Johnson ES.</p> <p>Next, I oppose any options that rezone our neighborhood from Freeman HS to Tucker HS. Many of my objections are similar to the ones outlined above with respect to Crestview ES. Doing so is opposed to the guidelines on geographic zones and accommodating the increased capacity of 32 students for Tucker can be managed in a less disruptive manner.</p> <p>My primary objection is the complete disregard for the use of major roads and distance as criteria. All but HS Option 2 move our neighborhood into the Tucker zone, disregarding Broad St and I-64. Tucker HS is farther from our neighborhood than Freeman HS; our neighborhood is 3.6 miles and 9 minutes from Freeman and 5.3 miles and 13 minutes, per Google Maps in ideal traffic conditions (representing an over 40% increase in both time and distance). And, getting to Tucker quickly would require using Broad St. or I-64, which presents timing/efficiency and safety issues. Both Broad St - with its high traffic and many red lights - and I-64 are prone to delay during both morning and evening rush hours. This presents problems for families getting to and from the school as well as introduces major potential inefficiencies to the bus system for HCPS. As some high school students are teen drivers, it seems fundamentally unsafe to practically require a route to school that involves either Broad St. or a major highway in order to make it to school quickly. In fact if you wanted to drive from our neighborhood to/from Tucker without using Broad St. or I-64 during rush hour, one route would require literally driving past Freeman HS. All in all, options to rezone our neighborhood from Freeman HS to Tucker HS seem inefficient, unsafe, and, frankly, absurd.</p> <p>My family purchased our home very intentionally and chose Henrico and specifically our neighborhood based on our school preferences. Overall, I strongly support Option 2 which would maintain the feeder pattern of Crestview ES > Tuckahoe MS > Freeman HS for our home in Monumental Floral Gardens.</p>

As follows: (1) Magnolia Ridge unarguably has been part of the established Glen Allen Community, for many years, since it's development. We live, shop, and volunteer in Glen Allen. We attend Glen Allen Day. Separating our neighborhood from Glen Allen violates the guideline for minimizing division of clearly identifiable communities. (2) The guideline regarding unitary school system is violated by moving a such a small percentage of Greenwood Elementary students to a different middle school than their peers. A positive transition from elementary school to middle school is crutial for every child. The plan to send Magnolia Ridge students to Brookland Middle School when over 75% of their friends would go to Hungary Creek is unacceptable. It's especially crutial for my Kindergarten boys. I am a parent of a child in 9th grade, currently attending Freeman High School. Our current school feeder pattern is Crestview, Tuckahoe, Freeman. We have lived here for 24+ years and I have a number of thoughts I would like to share with you.</p> <p>I strongly support High School OPTION 2 that keeps Crestview Elementary zoned to Tuckahoe Middle and Freeman High. This option does not bisect neighborhoods across Broad Street or across I-64. This keeps our community intact. We moved into this neighborhood for the diversity that came with these schools and the small close knit community that thrives at Crestview Elementary, and grows into Tuckahoe and Freeman.</p> <p>Our corridor and neighborhood is a diversity feeder to both Tuckahoe Middle and Freeman High, which strongly and positively benefits both schools and our community. Our neighborhood and immediate surrounding area is very socioeconomically diverse. Crestview families live in houses, apartments ranging in rental prices from under \$800 to well over \$2000, and a number of families live in homes with extended family members. Crestview serves a large amount of free/reduced lunches (over 50%). Each year, Crestview Elementary holds and International Dinner, and guests attend from all over the county to be a part of this very special event/occasion. According to the National Center for Educational Statistics, close to 50% of Crestview students identify as non-white students. If Crestview stopped feeding into Freeman and started feeding into Tucker it would have a major effect on the</p>

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			<p>diversity breakdown at those schools. Freeman High is a great opportunity for our Crestview students who may not have an option to attend a specialty center or another high performing school with a longstanding positive reputation like Freeman High. Removing this option and opportunity does the opposite of leveling the playing field for our students who may not have the same benefits the affluent students of Henrico County Public Schools already have.</p> <p>The route to Tucker versus Freeman from the Crestview zone is not at all ideal. To get to Tucker, one must either cross or use major and very busy roads/interstates (Broad Street or I64), or drive down Three Chopt, which means students would drive past Freeman to get to Tucker. Traffic patterns down these roads that are already busy with commuters will be negatively affected, and the county will bear the responsibility of forcing inexperienced drivers (juniors and seniors who drive themselves to school) to commute to school on an interstate or major, busy commuter roads.</p> <p>I also understand that some options consider moving the Westwood and Monumental Gardens neighborhoods out of the Crestview area. I think this would do a great disservice to the Crestview Community and I am highly opposed to any option that separates these key neighborhoods from our community.</p> <p>Finally, while my older 2 daughters have (or have nearly) completed their time in Henrico County schools (attending Crestview, Tuckahoe Middle, and Freeman), my youngest daughter has just started as a freshman at Freeman High School. I STRONGLY support the grandfathering position posted on your website, “High school students who move from one school zone to another with Henrico County may be permitted to remain until graduation only if the move occurred after completion of the tenth grade.” It is my hope that no matter which option is chosen, this grandfathering opportunity remains as it would be devastating to have my daughter ripped out of her community at Freeman a group of friends and classmates who are largely students who have attended Maybeury and Tuckahoe Elementary. To have the small community of Crestview students moved to Tucker in their Junior year would be an academic and social challenge that I don’t believe would be in the best interest of the schools or the students.</p>

This is a well-established community that would be broken up by a move to Tucker. 4. Capacity: Crestview Elementary could take on more students, as it is only at 87% capacity. My daughter is in currently in 9th grade and when this takes effect in 2021 she will be driving to school. Our current route to our school FREEMAN takes about 3 minutes: go up Monument/to Horsepen/to Three Chopt and sheâ€™s there. To get to Tucker, my daughter, a brand new driver, will conversely have to choose from one of 3 much LONGER and DANGEROUS more TRAFFIC RIDDEN routes (15-20 minutes or more of a commute). She will pass right by her previous school, Freeman, on Three Chopt, going through the Tuckahoe MS traffic, turning onto Parham, fighting all of the traffic coming off 64, with dangerous lane changes people make there merging from 64, then dangerous Parham/Skipwith/Homeview intersection. Alternatively and just as dangerous, she can take Horsepen/Glenside, to get on 64, get off at Parham, dealing with heavy morning commuter traffic on 64 and again having to fight to change lanes all the way to the left lane on Parham Rd, then deal with the Parham/Homeview intersection to get to Tuckerâ€™lots of accidents here, and a dangerous section of Parham. Or third, she can again fight the traffic of Horesepen/Glenside to Forest/Skipwith to Parham/Homeview. All 3 of these routes take her through multiple dangerous traffic areas when she could just be traveling the monument/Three Chopt corridor for a 3 minute commute to school. This says one thing to me as a parentâ€™ that HCPS does not care that her chances of being involved in a motor vehicle accident are significantly increased!!</p> <p>Additonally, I work at Glenside and Forest, and the bus /student/parent traffic that will increase in this already high-volume intersection is not good for our community or the people that live and work in it. We already wait at the Forest/Glenside light for an extended period of time between in the mornings between 8 and 9 and in the afternoons from 4-5:30 and we will be adding school/bus traffic to this area with the Crestview area who will now be trying to get to and from Tucker High School through this route. Lots of accidents here ALREADY and you will be adding to it!</p> <p>Also, I have a 4 year old who will be starting Kindergarten next year at Crestview, and her after school care is in Crestview. Changing our High school to Tucker means Crestview Elem. Parents who have to travel through the increased traffic at Glenside/Horsepen, to get to Crestview, then have to turn around and go back through all of this traffic to get back over to reach Tucker High school, when they could have just traveled the much safer and less traffic Monument/Three Chopt corridor to get to Freeman. Keeping Freeman as our HS keeps traffic more evenly spread in our community, and keeps our residents and children SAFE!!</p> <p>2) HCPS promised not to disrupt FEEDER PATTERNS in this process, and all options except for High School #2 option disrupts our feeder pattern in Crestview area significantly. This will have a profound negative impact on our kids! I have two younger children as well as a 14 year old, and my 1 and 4 yr olds will go to Crestview and Tuckahoe middle, play sports in our neighborhood, will build friendships/relationships with our neighboring kids, just as my 14 year old has, only to be RIPPED away from most their friends when they reach high school. THEY NEED TO STAY WITH ALL OF THEIR FRIENDS AT FREEMAN, THE FRIENDS THEY MADE AT TUCKAHOE MIDDLE SCHOOL and in our community sports! This change would tear an established community apart, and isolate one small section of the community. (Not to mention the fact that, based upon my scrutiny of the Option #4 map, the Jackson Davis community would be likewise torn apart along arbitrary neighborhood streets.) Pemberton Elementary is currently comprised of children from Gayton Forest and Raintree â€™ two neighboring subdivisions that have always formed one strong community. The residential roads, woods and bike/walking trails of Gayton Forest and Raintree are all interconnected allowing children to safely walk or ride bikes to visit and play with their Pemberton school friends. Recently the speed limit was rightly lowered along Falconbridge Drive to a reasonable 25mph, increasing the pedestrian and playful traffic along our friendly street! Common areas link our neighborhoods, and to walk through our community is to be reminded of the "good ol' days," where kids play safely, disconnected from devices, adults watch out as a village, and parents can call out when it's time to come home for dinner. These two neighborhoods share the same neighborhood pools during the summer. Community family social events are regularly planned, such as our Easter Egg Hunt and our Children's Halloween Parade and Costume Contest. One favorite community tradition is the Godwin Homecoming Parade which goes through both neighborhoods. Together these two neighborhoods make up one strong and well-developed community!</p> <p>As Henrico County teachers for 20 years, my husband and I both had the option of bringing our daughter to the schools where we teach on a variance. We chose to purchase a home in Gayton Forest largely *because* of Pemberton Elementary school. We love the schools at which we teach, but we adore the community in which we live, and the environment in which our daughter has flourished in Pemberton and our neighborhood. We have greatly anticipated our son being a Kindergarten penguin when our daughter is a 5th grader, and are deeply devastated to think that this overlap is in jeopardy.</p> <p>Separating the one strip of Gayton Forest and sending those children to a different elementary school than the rest of their community friends would be completely disruptive to their educational and emotional development. It would separate them from their neighborhood friends and rip apart an established community. Option #3 has a strangely carved out</p>

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			portion of our Raintree neighbors headed to Tucker HS as well! Why would the county create the bus pollution, and deprive neighborhood children the ability to walk to the school they can *hear* playing football games from their own yards? Wouldn't more students on the road increase obesity, the need for bus drivers, and decrease the ability of our students to participate in after school activities due to transportation limitations? The neighborhoods of Gayton Forest and Raintree are surrounded on all sides by four lane roads. An 8th grader and 6th grader at Tuckahoe Middle School, and a 3rd grader and Kindergartner at Crestview Elementary. Being a Crestview Elementary School family, we are at risk of being rezoned to Tucker High School. I'm an officer in the United States Air Force and completely understand that when making a decision, you must have multiple Courses of Action (COAs) in order to make a good decision, no matter how feasible a COA is. I want to detail why it is not a good decision to rezone Crestview for Tucker High School. 1. It is stated on the redistricting website that one of the major goals for this redistricting project is to "reduce concentrations of poverty while balancing a community or neighborhood school concept". Nearly half (44%) of the students that attend Crestview are considered "low-income". At Freeman, only 23% are considered "low-income", and that is with Crestview currently feeding into it. If Crestview is redistricted out of Freeman, the socio-economic (and racial) diversity that the committee is trying to achieve will not be met. My two oldest children are African-American, and the diversity at Freeman, that is fed through schools like Crestview makes me proud to send my kids there, from both races. 2. According to R10-08-002, it states that it needs to maintain the concept of geographic zoning. Middle School is a very vulnerable time, as an adolescence is trying to find themselves and where they fit in. According to the options that are currently being looked at, all of the Tucker High School options involve the Crestview students still attending Tuckahoe Middle School, but, then, when their friends go to one school, they are being separated from them and having to start new (except for the small Crestview population that is going with them) at Tucker High School. This doesnâ€™t sound like â€œmaintaining the concept of geographic zoningâ€œ. It leaves children vulnerable and alone. 3. Additionally, in R10-08-002, it states in section B number 6 that walking zones are important. At our location, walking to school may prove to be difficult; however, biking to school or school events is very much in the picture. We are 2.1 miles away from Freeman. We are almost double that to Tucker (3.8 miles). If the Crestview students are redistricted to Tucker, biking and walking are an impossibility, because of the major roads they will have to cross. Since it is nearly double, thatâ€™s more time, when they are able to drive, that student drivers are on the roads, especially the Glenside/64 interchange (a high accident area). 4. Finally, as stated earlier, I am in the military. I commute to DC every day. I doesnâ€™t make sense to make families drive double the distance to support the school for events, to pick up kids that are sick, or take kids late that have appointments. My wife has to do all of this on her own most days, and I am sure there are other single parent families that deal with similar situations. It just doesnâ€™t make logical sense when there are closer areas that could be utilized to attend Tucker. Thank you for your time in reading this and other comments from other concerned parents. This would also change the commute from a travel on Henrico County streets to a interstate commute which is something I do not particular think new drivers going to high school would be a good idea. This also appears to the most distant area to transfer into the Tucker school zone. Why would Henrico consider that on 3 out of 4 options? Our current school progression is from Crestview Elementary School, to Tuckahoe Middle School, to Freeman High School. The CAC wishes to keep that progression intact. Options 1, 3, and 4 would rezone the CAC students to J.R. Tucker High School. Option 4 would also further rezone the CAC students to Johnson Elementary School.</p> <p>In particular, the CAC wishes to voice its strong support for Option 2, while also expressing serious concerns about the other Options, including the proposal Option 4 that would alter both the present elementary school and high school assignments for members of our community. Our concerns relate to both the numerical impacts of Options 1, 3, and 4, as well as several other qualitative concerns with respect to those same options.</p> <p>I. The CAC Urges Continuation of the Current Feeder Pattern for its Members</p> <p>Currently, four Options have been made public, and this letter addresses those four options, including their estimated statistical impact. The CAC also understands that more options may be presented during the public comment period, and the CAC will likely address any additional Options as well. To be clear, however, the CAC has concerns with any proposal that would seek to revise the current feeder pattern of Crestview Elementary School, to Tuckahoe Middle School, to Freeman High School. The reasoning that follows, especially in Section III, would apply to any future Option that would disrupt that current feeder pattern. Number of Students Affected in High School</p> <p>â€€ Option 1: 1,329 â€€ Option 2: 927 â€€ Option 3: 1,963 â€€ Option 4: 1,274</p> <p>Option 2 is most favorable, and considerably so when compared to every other option.</p> <p>D. Overall Number of Students Affected Across All School Levels</p> <p>â€€ Option 1: 2,787 â€€ Option 2: 2,960 â€€ Option 3: 4,643 â€€ Option 4: 4,029</p> <p>This demonstrates that Options 3 and 4 affect far greater numbers of students than Options 1 and 2. For those reasons, the CAC strongly believes that those two Options should be rejected.</p> <p>Additionally, these numbers also show that the numerical difference between Options 1 and 2 is largely negligible. However, Option 2 affects 492 fewer students at the middle school and high school levels than Option 1, which makes Option 2 preferable. Indeed, middle school and high school is where students participate in the majority of their clubs, sports, and extracurricular activities. It is also where students are currently engaged in technical/career training and college guidance counseling. Therefore, to minimize disruption to those students, Option 2 is the preferred option.</p> <p>III. Several Non-Numerical Factors Favor Option 2</p> <p>Independent from the numbers favoring Option 2, the CAC believes that several additional considerations specified in the School Boardâ€™s redistricting guidelines also strongly favor Option 2 and disfavor the remaining Options, as well as maintaining the current feeder pattern for the CAC more generally. The following considerations are informed by the Boardâ€™s stated guidelines to: (1) where feasible, use major roads and natural boundaries to define attendance zones; (2) make all reasonable efforts to ensure contiguous geographic zones that minimize division of clearly identifiable community components; and (3) make efforts to establish walking schools and zones where feasible; and (4) ensure efficient transportation.</p> <p>First, Options 1, 3, and 4 would result in our children crossing major roads to go to school, creating unnecessary danger, removing the potential for walking/biking to school, and making transportation unnecessarily inefficient. The CAC community exists south of Broad Street, which is a major road and natural boundary for zoning purposes. Indeed, Broad Street currently serves as a basis for school zoning. That makes sense. Broad Street is a busy and dangerous road to cross, especially for buses filled with elementary school children or high schoolers who may be just starting to drive (juniors and seniors who drive themselves to school). The CAC has substantial safety concerns about requiring our children to traverse Broad Street and/or Interstate 64 to get to school, especially at the busy times of day they would be commuting in heavy traffic.</p> <p>The failure to maintain natural boundaries defined by major roads would also substantially increase the commute for a number of CAC members. For instance, currently from the Duntreath neighborhood, a bus simply accesses Three Chopt Road and then goes 1.5 miles to Freeman High School. To access J.R. Tucker High School from that area more than doubles the distance and time, and the only options to get to J.R. Tucker High School for these students would be to either take Interstate 64 or Broad Street or else drive on secondary roads that themselves pass Freeman High School.</p> <p>Second, socioeconomic concerns also strongly favor Option 2. Removing Crestview Elementary from the Freeman High School zone does not reduce concentrations of poverty, assist vulnerable students, or promote diversity. Just the opposite would be true. Presently, Crestview Elementary School, Tuckahoe Elementary School, and Maybeury Elementary School all send 100% of their students to Freeman High School. Over half of the Crestview Elementary School population is eligible for a free/reduced meal, whereas Tuckahoe Elementary School students only have 5% of their population eligible and Maybeury School Elementary only has 35% of their student population eligible. Freeman High School currently has 32% of their students eligible for a free/reduced meal, while J.R. Tucker High School has 51% eligible. Freeman High Schoolâ€™s percentage is fed largely by Crestview Elementary Schoolâ€™s population. Removing the Crestview Elementary School population from Freeman High School will further drop that percentage at Freeman High School, which is counter to the Boardâ€™s guidelines. Indeed, Crestview Elementary School has the most diverse ethnic student body in all of the West End of Henrico County. Removing Crestview Elementary School from Freeman High School segregates this diverse population, making Freeman High School much less diverse.</p>

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			<p>Freeman High School also is a great opportunity for our Crestview Elementary School students who may not have an option to attend a specialty center or another high performing school with a longstanding positive reputation like Freeman High School. Removing that option and opportunity does the opposite of leveling the playing field for our students who may not have the same benefits the affluent students of Henrico County Public Schools already have.</p> <p>It should also be noted that Crestview Elementary prides itself on the attention paid to both students with learning disabilities and students who are learning English as a secondary language (a large percentage of the student base). We live in the Duntreath neighborhood and have children at Tuckahoe Middle School (grade 6) and Freeman High School (grade 9). Our children love their current schools and have formed very tight relationships in the community, particularly in the band program. We feel that providing the continuity in the current school pattern will benefit all students who would be in the Crestview/Tuckahoe/Freeman districts. For example, our daughter participated in the 8th grade marching band program in conjunction with Freeman and that experience has laid a foundation for her to want to pursue music in college. Had she been moved to Tucker, she wouldn't have continued those relationships with her band director and fellow musicians and quite honestly, I'm not sure she'd be where she is today as a student and a person without that program at Freeman High School. The need for continuity from middle school relationships to high school relationships and programs cannot be underscored. Another reason we wish to remain in the Freeman district is safety. As has been promised by the county, safety is a high priority for our students and major roads have always been used as school boundaries. Our teenage students will have to drive past Freeman in order to get to Tucker High School if we are re-zoned or drive on busier roads (Skipwith Road, Parham Road, Broad St. or I-64) instead of an easily driven route directly east and west on Three Chopt Road. We see the intrinsic value in providing our children with opportunities to practice life skills such as driving in a safer environment than having them navigate major roads on the way to and from school, particularly after late-night returns from games and marching competitions. In the same vein of safety and transportation, if parents have one student at Tuckahoe Middle School and one at Tucker High School, it becomes very difficult to arrange early dismissals for things such as orthodontist appointments or early drop-offs for things such as tutoring or club/intramural programs. Should I have a student at Tucker High School participating in an early morning activity (where bus transportation is not offered), my drive time will almost double. The distance from our neighborhood to Tucker is almost twice as far as the distance to Freeman. I am a teacher in the city of Richmond and being in my classroom on time is imperative. Should my children be sent to Tucker, I will likely need to find other employment. 			<p>I am a Freeman graduate and moved my family to the Freeman area and district so that we can be a part of and share in the strong and diverse elements that make this community so strong and unique. Freeman sits at the very core of this community. It is not just my love of Freeman that drives me to write. My appreciation of Freeman that is based on the history of my childhood: I grew up in Goochland County and went to an extremely diverse elementary school. However, for middle school my family moved to Short Pump where I went to Pocahontas middle school. Here, I experienced some kind of reverse culture shock. I canâ€™t remember the exact number of non-white students in my grade, but my 13 year old self does remember a few things. There were only two black kids in my class that I knew of. Most of my friends were driven to school instead of taking the bus, because their Moms didnâ€™t work. I remember the education was solid. The school was beautiful. The teachers were fabulous. Basically, I was surrounded by privilege. However, although I am a person of privilege myself, I struggled being surrounded by so many the SAME type of person, primarily upper middle class, Caucasian classmates. For that and other reasons, I applied to and was accepted into the Freeman Leadership Center. High school was certainly not a high point in my life, but I can appreciate the tremendous impact Freemanâ€™s culture, diversity, and education had on my being and my future. What Iâ€™ve now realized as an adult is that Freeman was essentially a microcosm of our county, and our world. At Freeman, my friends were all different colors and from different backgrounds. Many spoke different languages and/or were born in other countries. As students, we had to learn about people who were different than us in every way. My black friends taught me why the rebel flag was offensive. My Bosnian friends taught me why all their (female) names ended with â€œAâ€™s. I heard other languages being spoken in the hall. I (finally!) had other friends who like myself, had divorced parents, or were from single parent households. I had teachers that accepted everyone for who they were and wherever they came from. I had friends who drove brand new cars, and friends who werenâ€™t sure whether theyâ€™d get a dinner that nightâ€ </p> <p>My point is that Freeman is not just a school. It is a community and a culture in of itself, one that effects every student t that goes there. To take away the Crestview district from Freeman would be taking away what makes Freeman Freeman, the core of its essence - its diversity.</p> <p>Tucker is a fabulous school, donâ€™t get me wrong. However, it is already an extremely diverse school (which is one of the reasons its so great). Crestview, our area in question, is an extremely diverse area and elementary school. 48.4% of Crestview is non-Caucasian and 48.9% are economically disadvantaged. To eliminate Crestview as a feeder school to Freeman would significantly lessen Freemanâ€™s diversity, something that is so essential to Freemanâ€™s culture, community, and ultimately I feel, its success. Taking away from Freemanâ€™s racial and socio-economic diversity while adding to Tuckers would do both schools a major disservice.</p> <p>There are many additional reasons as to why Option 2, the only option that keeps the Crestview district feeding in Tuckahoe and then Freeman, is crucial for our community. Tucker is double the distance that Freeman is from our neighborhood (Charles Glen), and even further for the rest of the neighborhoods that attend Crestview. Freeman is 2.5 miles from Charles Glen, whereas Tucker is 4. One HCPS guideline states â€œEfforts will be made to establish walking schools and reasonable walking zones where feasibleâ€. Many students from our neighborhood bike to Freeman, and some even walk. To access Tucker there are 4 options from our neighborhood, and none are walk or bike friendly. You can take I-64 or Broad Street, which we all know are major commuter roads that are not ideal for young teen drivers, or anyone for that matter. The other two options are to drive right by Freeman, or take Skipwith Road. Skipwith is the least desirable option due to the narrow two lanes and immense traffic that already exists along Skipwith (practically standstill during rush hour). I also know of many Freeman high school students who drop their siblings off at Tuckahoe middle, just .6 of a mile down the road. Parents are able to access both schools easily to pick up their children when needed.</p> <p>Itâ€™s important to note that rezoning Crestview to Tucker would also have an impact on student cohesiveness and maintaining consistent feeder schools, another major community impact. For options 1, 3 and 4, a large portion of middle school students would no longer go to high school together. Additionally, Tucker is on the other side of 64 from our neighborhood, which does not align with the HCPS guideline where â€œMajor roads and natural boundaries will be used whenever feasible to define attendance zonesâ€. A majority of activities in our neighborhood and community occur along the Monument avenue corridor south of I-64 and Broad street. This is where we go to church and synagogue, where our children go to preschool and play sports, where we work out, and where we shop, eat and play - all of this occurs from Three Chopt to River Road.</p> <p>I could go on and onâ€ but I fear this letter would become too long. We love Crestview. It is extraordinarily diverse and is set in a neighborhood where many of my sonâ€™s best friends live. He is in the second grade at Crestview; our daughter hopefully will follow him there soon.</p> <p>Having viewed the proposed maps and weighed them against the redistricting committeeâ€™s stated goals, I implore the committee to retain our Crestview community as much as possible and object to any plan that would arbitrarily slice the existing zone with half of us sent to Johnson Elementary, or that would ultimately send our children to Tucker High instead of the much closer Freeman High.</p> <p>First, removing much of Crestviewâ€™s current population to Johnson would not meet the committeeâ€™s stated goals. I have seen statistics showing Crestview has more excess capacity than other surrounding elementary schools; it should be adding student population, not displacing students to another school. Moreover, Crestview is south of Broad Street, as is its entire student population. Shifting students (including our own children) to Johnson would require transit across Broad Street, despite the committeeâ€™s stated intention to avoid crossing major thoroughfares and disrupting traffic patterns. There is a better way: keeping the current Crestview community intact.</p> <p>Second, moving the entire current Crestview population to Tucker High is unreasonable. Crestview is highly diverse; half its students receive free or reduced lunches. Removing Crestview from the Freeman matriculation pattern would render Freeman incredible homogeneous, lacking any semblance of diversity. What is more, Tucker is not proximate to the current Crestview population. Tucker is a mile further away from our home than Freeman. Indeed, a primary way to get to Tucker passes right by Freeman. Other routes require travel or major thoroughfares or congested arterial roads. Breaking up Crestview-Tuckahoe-Freeman will have significant traffic impacts.</p> <p>Finally, there is the concern of retaining a cohesive educational and developmental experience. Under these options, Church Run is separated from Windsor Place, our neighboring community, even though there is no major road or natural boundary of separation. These two neighborhoods share a walking path and many Windsor Place residents walk to Church Run to use the pool and tennis courts. Church Road is actually the natural boundary/ major road that should be consider for attendance zones.</p> <p>Next, "all reasonable efforts should be made to ensure contiguous geographic zones which minimize division of clearly identifiable community components." As previously stated, Church Run and Windsor Place are geographically contiguous, as they are joined by a walking path. The communities are intertwined as they share recreational facilities.</p> <p>Third, "efforts will be made to establish walking schools and reasonable walking zones where feasible." This is the kicker for Church Run! There is currently a \$25 million road construction project underway to add sidewalks, crosswalks and widen Church Road. Church Run residents are giving up their land, fences, and trees to accommodate this. We are going to be subjected to years of noise, traffic and disruption while the road project is underway. The silver lining is that our children would be able to (more safely) walk and bike to PMS. Don't take this option away! The school is less than 10 minutes and less than a mile away from Church Run. Moving Church Run to QMS makes no sense, as it eliminates the student's ability to walk to school. Further, a dedicated walking path is being built (confirmed by the Board of Supervisors)--give our kids the opportunity to use this taxpayer funded path!</p> <p>Next, "efforts will be made to ensure an efficient system of school bus transportation." Church Run is less than one mile from PMS and the entrance is located on the sample street as PMS. It doesn't get more efficient than that. If students are moved to QMS, buses would have to go through Three Chopt Road/Church Road, Gaskins Road/Three Chopt Road, Gaskins Road/Ridgefield Parkway, and Gaskins Road/Quioccasin Road intersections. This results in increased traffic, costs, and ride times. 8:05:03 AM PDT			<p>Thank you again for taking the time to consider my concerns.</p> <p>I live in Church Run, the neighborhood bisected by Church Run Pkwy, bordered by the major roads Three Chopt Rd on the north and Church Rd on the east. In the middle school option 1 plan, Church Run is routed to Quioccasin instead of Pocahontas Middle School.</p> <p>I noticed that a stated goal of the redistricting is "Major roads and natural boundaries will be used whenever feasible to define attendance zones." Church Road and Three Chopt Road are major roads which serve as natural boundaries, but in the plan, Quioccasin's boundary stretches beyond Church Road to annex the Church Run neighborhood.</p> <p>Using Church Road as a boundary seems to make sense. First, making the school bus cross Church Road, especially in the morning when there is a great deal of traffic with folks from many neighborhoods trying to get to Interstates 295 or 64, likely adds time to the bus routes. And bus routes from that part of town to Quioccasin are already going to be very long rides for kids.</p> <p>Also, there are safety concerns. Our children play sports together, swim together in the summer, and come together for community events regularly. During the last major Henrico County redistricting in 2009, we were shuffled when half of the Pemberton Corridor was moved from Godwin to Freeman. Now that we have adjusted and formed a solid community pulling into Freeman High School, one of the options shuffles and splits us apart once again to take part the corridor to Tucker and keep part at Freeman. This map (option 3) seems arbitrary and illogical, as it does not use major roads as boundaries and splits a community that has already had to experience change and adjustment in recent years. Three Chopt Road is a natural boundary for zoning, with areas south of Three Chopt feeding into Freeman (and Godwin further west) and areas north of Three Chopt feeding into Tucker.</p> <p>One of the big issues that I have come to understand since my son started middle school at Quiocassin, and also from looking at these redistricting documents, is that Quioccasin is the only middle school in Henrico County that splits off into three different high schools (Godwin, Freeman, and Tucker). This is detrimental to our children because middle school is such an important developmental period for peer bonding and friendships, and our kids are really divided up as they make the already difficult transition to high school. Every other middle school feeds into one or two high schools. Geographically, it makes sense for Quioccasin to feed into Godwin and Freeman, and for Tuckahoe Middle to feed into Tucker and Freeman. However, one problem is that the zoning for Quiocassin Middle is complicated - it pulls in students from the Skipwith area who should clearly go to Tuckahoe (they have to drive past Tuckahoe Middle to get to Quioccasin) and areas north of Three Chopt Road, which should all go to Tuckahoe Middle then Tucker High. Meanwhile, the entire area south of Patterson and west of Parham pulls all the way to Tuckahoe Middle (even the areas west of Gaskins which are clearly much closer to Quioccasin). This entire area goes from Tuckahoe MS to Freeman HS, keeping them together while our area is split up into three different schools. It would make more sense for some of these areas to go to Quioccasin Middle, then Freeman High, opening space at Tuckahoe Middle for the areas north of Three Chopt to feed into Tuckahoe Middle, then Tucker High. This would offer greater continuity for students and allow more Quioccasin Middle School students to stay with classmates during the critical transition from middle to high school.</p> <p>For students in Pinedale Farms and the adjacent Fort King/Pinebluff area neighborhoods and the new Pemberton Ridge development (as well as those across Pemberton), it is logical to walk or bike straight down Three Chopt Road to Freeman High. As an educator, I can appreciate the need for periodic redistricting and the complexities of such a project. As the committees continue to develop Options 1-4 with the redistricting plans, I would urge them to consider the following:</p> <p>The Three Chopt Road expansion project and walkability to our current zoned middle school: Henrico County has been working with our neighborhood and others on the Three Chopt Road expansion project for the last five years. Through its developmental stages, the project supervisors have consistently communicated the benefits of the project and how it will create a more pedestrian community. The county has purchased an easement from our property at 11304 Anna Way, which will be impacted in order to build a sidewalk directly behind our house which will lead straight to Pocahontas Middle School. Pocahontas MS is less than a mile from our neighborhood, and is walking distance. At the public information session at Glen Allen High School on September 11th, when Cropper GIS Consulting explained some of the factors the committees would be asked to consider, Mr. Cropper explained that walkability would be considered when determining school districts. One of the few direct benefits us having a two-year road project take place right behind our home (which backs up to Three Chopt) is that the final result will be safe sidewalks that are projected to be finished just in time for my children to use them when attending Pocahontas MS. Our community will be sacrificing a great deal over the next few years with this construction to get to the finished product. To think that our children will be potentially changed to Quiocassin Middle School, which is a significantly longer traveling distance and is outside of our pedestrian community, is disappointing. He needs lots of support in reading and I worry that he will not receive that at Brooklyn. Greenwood and Hungary Creek has worked hard over the years to establish a strong relationship, and to prepare the 5th graders to transition to Hungary Creek. My 6th grader transitioned from Greenwood to Hungary Creek very well thanks to these efforts. Oldhouse Run and Rockstone are the same neighborhood. There are three proposals (Options 1, 3, and 5) that put Oldhouse Run in one elementary school and Rockstone in another. There is no dividing line whatsoever between Oldhouse Run and Rockstone. I invite anyone creating these proposals to drive down Boardman Lane from Rockstone into Oldhouse Run. You will not be able to tell where one ends and the other begins. There is not even a stop sign on Boardman Lane separating them. The school bus goes in one and out the other. Putting these two subdivisions in two different elementary schools is unreasonable.</p> <p>For high school, HCPS just redistricted the western side of Pemberton Rd. (Quail Run, Rockstone, Oldhouse Run, Gateshead, Candlewood, Spring Tree) from Godwin (where we had been since Godwin and the neighborhoods were built) ten years ago. It is not right to redistrict us to a third high school. Families are big supporters of their kids' high schools, and it took a number of years to make the emotional switch from being Godwin Eagles to Freeman Rebels. You have stated that the committee has several goals as you prepare these drafts. The goals are: a) avoid splitting a neighborhood b) avoid introducing safety concerns crossing major roads and highways c)preserving natural boundaries d)avoid taking way ability to walk to school e)avoid changing a feeder pattern f)avoid moving students from two areas that consequently doesn't change the enrollment utilization However, as we look at the draft options we can see that ALL of the goals have been IGNORED. All current drafts violate the goals that the committee has stated they will base their decisions on. *Here is how the committee goals are being disregarded by all the current draft options:* a)Avoid splitting a neighborhood: While Cross Keys, Dover Hunt and Cedar Chase were built in different decades, they are a continuous neighborhood surrounded by major roads of Gaskins, Ridgefield and Church Rd. They utilize the same community pool and feed from Short Pump ES and Pocahontas MS. Our children all play together and have known each other for years. These draft options would tear these kids away from their friends and will create a division within the neighborhood. It will also double the amount of buses that come through our neighborhood, creating a safety issue. b)Avoid introducing safety concerns crossing major roads and highways: Elementary: To get to SPES we only need to cross one major road.....Three Chopt. The commute is not long and traffic is not significant. To get to JDES we would have to take Three Chopt to Parham, which will negatively impact the already heavy traffic on that route, and make the commute that much longer. Middle: Currently, we only have to cross 1 major road, Three Chopt to get to PMS, which is just a few minutes up the street. The commute is short and the traffic not significant. To get to QMS we would have to take Three Chopt to Gaskins to Quioccasin, or go all the way through our neighborhood to the other side to Ridgefield to Gaskins to Quioccasin. This creates

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			<p>more traffic on already busy Gaskins Rd and Quioccasin Rd, and adds more time to the commute.</p> <p>High School: The route to Tucker versus Godwin from Cross Keys neighborhood is not at all ideal. To get to Tucker, one must either cross or use major and very busy roads/interstates (Parham Road or I-64), or drive down Three Chopt, away from Tucker and then back down Parham. None of these routes provide a safe walking option as we currently have straight to Godwin. Traffic patterns down these roads that are already busy with commuters will be negatively affected, and the county will bear the responsibility of forcing inexperienced drivers (juniors and seniors who drive themselves to school) to commute to school on an interstate or major, busy commuter roads.</p> <p>c)Preserving natural boundaries: It would make sense to say that school districts would be divided by major roads...Parham, Gaskins, Three Chopt, Pump Rd and so on. But as we look at these maps we can see that those natural boundaries are not being met. These drafts go right down neighborhood streets and split one side of the street to one district and the other side to a different district. if you were to look at Gaskins Rd....the side of Gaskins Rd towards Pemberton should belong to QMS because that makes sense. Just as the side of Gaskins towards Pump should belong to PMS. But these drafts go into neighborhoods and create divisive lines through the neighborhood. Cross Keys is really a part of a larger interconnected neighborhood that includes Cross Keys, Dover Hunt, and Cedar Chase. There is a natural contiguous traffic pattern that links Three Chopt Road, Church Road, and Ridgefield Parkway through these neighborhoods. The options that move the Cross Keys and Dover Hunt children to Davis, do not move the Cedar Chase children. This actually creates a situation where a natural boundary would be disturbed and would force the county to double the number of bus routes through the neighborhood. This will also increase safety concerns in this neighborhood.</p> <p>d)Avoid taking away ability to walk to school: To be honest, this particular goal was just thrown out the window with these drafts. To take the children of Cross Keys out of GHS and move them to Tucker is absurd. Currently Godwin High School is the only walkable school option available to Cross Keys students. Through the interconnected neighborhoods, students can walk most of the way to Godwin. The remainder of the way has options for sidewalks and cross walks. By the time students are high school age, this walk is possible. Moving them to Tucker would completely eliminate walking as an option for these students. Its actually even dangerous for them to drive to Tucker. SPES and PMS are literally up the street from Cross Keys, but you want to move our children to schools which are significantly further away, and which would create traffic and safety hazards.</p> <p>e)Avoid changing a feeding pattern: Right now the feeding pattern is SPES-PMS-GHS. Our children would follow their classmates through all levels. Any option that sends these students to JDES-QMS-THS would involve switching these students peer group with whom they attend school at all school levels. Under the current proposed feeder options, Cross Keys students have no continuity of classmates. QMS is not a natural feeder school for these students under any scenario. QMS under all options is a natural feeder school to Freeman High School which is not a feeder option for any of the proposed scenarios. After the vote, two committee members tried to have Option 6 pushed through anyway, despite it only receiving two votes. Their points were that it would provide a very different choice with much greater socioeconomic diversity, and that it would prompt a more robust public discussion at large. Another committee member stated Option 6 had some positive attributes, but that it goes much too far. The committee then took a second vote to decide whether Option 6 should be brought forward as a third choice in November. Only 2 of 22 committee members voted to do so, therefore the suggestion failed - reflecting major flaws in Option 6. However, the consultant stated that no map option is off the table simply because it isnâ€™t brought to the November informational sessions. This begs the question, will Option 6 or something similar be resurrected at the last minute at the School Board vote in May 2020, regardless of the committeeâ€™s collective work? If the primary objective is to be hyper-focused on socioeconomic adjustments and send this process off the rails, then Option 6 is the one to choose. So in other words, it pulls folks from the opposite side of a major roadway, yet not the folks on the same side of the major roadway as the school.</p> <p>Because our neighborhood is on the same side of the major roadway as the school (Glen Allen HS), my children could walk or bike to school if desired and not have to cross any major roadways nor dangerous intersections.</p> <p>Another basis for my request to keep the HS boundary along Staples Mill & Hungary Roads is to follow feeder patterns. If the proposed changes of High School Option 3 take place, it will break the feeder pattern of Echo Lake Elementary.</p> <p>Currently Echo Lake is a 100% feeder to Glen Allen HS. By not following the major roadway boundary (like High School Option 3 currently proposes), it will make Echo Lake have an extremely small split (94% Glen Allen / 6% Hermitage) according to the numbers â€” where it was previously not split at all.</p> <p>Here is the basis of those numbers: The neighborhoods currently excluded if HS Option #3 boundary remains the same and does not follow the major roadway boundary concept are census tracts 10314 & 16309. These census tracts only contribute 41 out of the 598 Echo Lake projected capacity. Likewise, it would make Echo Lake ES which is a 100% feeder to Glen Allen HS, now put on a 94% to 6% split (so it doesnâ€™t meet the continuous K-12 guideline, nor feeder pattern guidelines initially set forth).</p> <p>And if you break it down even further, as mentioned above, our Staples Mill Trace subdivision (census tract #10314) only adds 5 students to this overall capacity. So the impact of redistricting our neighborhood alone away from Glen Allen HS would have an even smaller effect than the current 94% to 6% split described above in the current HS Option 3 proposal.</p> <p>Additionally, if we (#10314) were redistricted away from Glen Allen High school (as HS Option 3 currently proposes), then we would be the ONLY development on our side of Staples Mill Rd (major roadway) that would not attend Glen Allen HS. As mentioned in previous writings, our little 13-house cul-de-sac subdivision is located ON Staples Mill Rd, the next street East of Coles Point Rd (Cross ridge subdivision) and the Lanceor Dr subdivision â€” both of which attend Glen Allen HS along with our neighborhood. If we were redistricted away from Glen Allen HS, then we would be the ONLY subdivision on our entire side of Staples Mill Rd that does not attend Glen Allen HS. Every other subdivision on our side of Staples Mill Road (a major roadway) would attend these schools, with the exception of our small 13 house subdivision (Census Tract 10314).</p> <p>We can look out our subdivision entrance and see/walk to Cross ridge, which ultimately backs up against Glen Allen HS, illustrating the close proximity to the school. And as you are aware, Echo Lake, Hungary Creek and Glen Allen HS are all within a few hundred feet of one another, which again illustrates our close proximity to all these schools.</p> <p>If the committee is looking for options of folks for HS option 3 to redistrict away from Glen Allen HS, I would propose considering alternatives for those folks South of Hungary Road (a major roadway), that are located between Hungary Rd, Springfield Rd, and West End Drive. These folks currently attend Tucker HS I believe, and with the expansion of Tucker HS it may be an option for them. Additionally, as another option, the committee could consider folks East of the Railroad tracks and South of I-295 as an option to send to Hermitage HS as well. Again, these are just suggestions for the committee to consider if looking for additional capacity, and still follow the goals of the project (following major roadways/natural barriers, etc).</p> <p>All that being said, our proposal is to ask the committee to follow the major roadways as the boundary and to have/keep our neighborhood (#10314) in Echo Lake ES, Hungary Creek MS, and Glen Allen HS.</p> <p>Additionally, could you please update the â€”Subdivision Concerns and Mapâ€” with this request? Our original request was sent out in 2 parts - one to the Elementary Committee and one to the Secondary Committee. These original requests are on pages 48 (for Elementary) and 162 (for Secondary) in the â€”General Feedback as of October 15â€. The â€”Subdivision Concerns and Mapâ€” only captured the Elementary school request, not the middle/high school request. Could you please update the â€”Subdivision Concerns and Mapâ€” to have the â€”Staples Mill Traceâ€” subdivision request to say Echo Lake ES, Hungary Creek MS, and Glen Allen HS?</p> <p>Respectfully, of course these proposals are just options for the committee to consider. The continuity of community, family, and sibling relationships to the school should be a major consideration for any option. Variances for HS students (regardless of grade, not limited to juniors or seniors) and siblings in middle school should considered and granted for any option that would remove them from the current feeder pattern. Major highways, thoroughfares, and subdivision developments could and should define the boundaries for feeder patterns. I cannot see where options 1, 3,4,5, or 6 takes these factors into consideration.
